Looking for a job?

Changes in Highway Traffic Act

I would like to bring to your attention some changes which have been made to the Highway Traffic Act in regards to an out of province students' motor vehicle registration and driver's licence. Out of province students who are enrolled in University school or college in PEI will be allowed to operate their vehicle registered in their home jurisdiction. As well, an out of province student who is enrolled in a university, college or school in the province will be allowed to drive with a valid licence issued to him/her by another jurisdiction without exchanging for a PEI license within 120 days.

Concerns in these areas have been expressed by the students from the Atlantic region and exchange students. Further inquiries into driver licensing and vehicle registration may be directed to the Highway Safety Division at 368-5200.
