Rebel Against Collecting Taxes

MARSHALL, Tex., Aug. 7—(AP)—The United States Government moved yesterday against the bank accounts of tax-rebelling Marshall housewives and found seven had withdrawn their money.

Two Internal Revenue Bureau agents showed up at the Marshall National Bank with Federal seizure warrants, and orders that accounts of the housewives and their husbands be made available for inspection.

The housewives claim it is unconstitutional to ask them to serve as tax collectors by withholding taxes from the wages of their domestic servants. They have said they will carry the fight to the U. S. Supreme Court.

Another way to add variety to muffins is to stir in raisins, dried fruits, grated cheese, chopped ham or bacon, into the dry ingredients just before adding the liquid to the muffins. If fresh or well-drained cooked, canned or frozen fruit is folded into the muffin batter just before it is put in the pan, in a matter of minutes, you will be taking from the oven a batch of most colourful and appetizing muffins. Blueberry and blackberry muffins are, of course, favourites of this type, but other berries, finely chopped apples or fruits are delicious too. Just one little reminder about baking muffins. A hot oven is necessary but do not have it too hot or a crust will form before the muffins have finished rising and the batter will break through the crust, spill over the side and form a "knob".
