

Oddfellowship.

The issue of the Dominion Oddfellow, for April, contains an excellent article by Mr. Benj. Bremner, P. G. M., of this city, under the heading "A Review of Oddfellowship." The Order is traced from its inception at Baltimore, Md., on April 26th, 1819, up to the present date, and the figures given show the rapid advancement and grand work of this benevolent institution. In addition to the degrees of a Subordinate Lodge, the Rebekah Degree for the wives, widows or daughters of Oddfellows was instituted Sept. 20, 1851, the author being Schuyler Colfax, ex-Vice-President of the U. S. The different branches of the Order may be stated as follows:— Subordinate Lodge, having 4 Degrees. Subordinate Encampment, having 3 Degrees. Rebekah Degree Lodge, having 1 Degree. Canton of Patriarchs Militant, 1 Degree. From 1830 to 1887, the work accomplished in America alone is as follows:— Number of members received... 1,328,189 Number of widowed families relieved... 169,706 Total paid for relief... \$46,020,800.79 Taking the year 1887 alone we find expended on this Continent:— For relief by Lodges... \$2,119,457.35 " Encampments... 216,634.86 " Rebekah Lodges... 17,673.91 Total relief in 1887... \$2,353,766.02 The Order throughout the world numbers a grand total of 1,201,656, or 118,664 more than the Masonic fraternity, which stands next in numbers. There are also over 40,000 Daughters of Rebekah, who are engaged alike in striving to ameliorate the condition of suffering humanity; also orphan's homes controlled by the Order in different parts of the Continent, where the children of deceased members are properly cared for, educated and made good citizens, and in a number of the largest cities throughout the Continent there are Oddfellow's Employment Bureaus, which have done great good in furnishing employment to worthy brothers.

Personal.

The King of Greece buys his clothes in London. The Queen buys hers in Paris. The English press is demanding a new song for use at public meetings in place of "He's a jolly good fellow," which, it is insisted, is inappropriate to Gladstone, Salisbury and almost everybody else in whose honor it is now sung. There is an epidemic of suicide in the Austrian army. The latest and most sensational was that of Lieut. Mangusius, at Klansburg. He seemed depressed, and, leaving his comrades, went into a room where a number of rifles were kept. Taking one of these, he called a soldier and ordered him to show if he could aim properly. "Point at my left eye," said the lieutenant, and the soldier, without any idea that the gun was loaded, did so. The lieutenant gave the usual commands to make ready, present and fire, the soldier obeying each, and being horrified at the last to see the gun discharged and the lieutenant fall dead. The correctness of the soldier's aim was proven, for the ball had gone through the left eye. The lieutenant had left a letter to his captain saying that the soldier who would shoot him would be entirely innocent. An explanation was recently given in the *Moniteur du Rome* of a rumor which, it appears, had been circulated in parts of the continent, to the effect that Queen Victoria and the Empress Dowager Frederick contemplated embracing Roman Catholicism. The story seems to have originated somewhat obscurely out of some conversations that passed at Her Majesty's tea table. The subject of Italy and the Vatican coming up, the Empress Dowager repeated some remarks to her late husband after his return, when Crown Prince, from a visit to Pope Leo XIII. On that occasion the late Emperor expressed the utmost respect for the personal character of His Holiness, the Empress Dowager said that, ever since, she has entertained a sentiment of veneration for the aged Pontiff. The Queen at once rejoined that she shared those sentiments, but nothing was said either of joining the Church of Rome or of the struggle between the Vatican and Italy. The *Moniteur* based its version of the incident on a communication from London to the *Correspondence de l'Est*.

Where Lent is Kept in Earnest.

Nowhere in Europe is Lent kept so rigorously as it is in Russia. There the faithful eat neither meat, eggs, milk nor butter during the entire 40 days. Even in cooking, oil is used instead of butter or lard, and not even the children are allowed to drink milk. On the day before Easter nothing is eaten, and just before midnight the people all go to church, bearing with them provisions of every description. At the stroke of 12 the church, which has previously been kept in utter darkness, is suddenly illuminated, and then, after the food has been blessed, the eating begins and the people satisfy their hunger leaving the sacred edifice. On Easter Sunday, everybody has the privilege of saluting whoever he may chance to meet with three kisses on the cheek. Even the Emperor himself is not exempt from this custom, and it was the custom in former years for the Czar to walk abroad on that day to receive the embraces of his people, but this custom has been discontinued by the present Emperor Alexander, who is afraid of being killed by the Nihilists, and does not care to court publicity in such a manner.

News Notes.

Boulanger has telegraphed from Brussels declaring it untrue that the Belgian authorities requested him to leave Belgium. The English press comments favorably on the progress of military education in Canada, especially in connection with the cavalry school to be established in Toronto. Col. Oter, as commandant of the infantry school, is mentioned with respect as the officer who had charge of the Wimbledon team some years ago. Two hundred thousand tons of iron and steel shipping built on four English and Scottish rivers in a single year is a large output. This is the amount attributed to the Clyde, the Tyne, the Mersey, and the Thames in 1887.

Ottawa Notes.

By an order-in-council, just passed, the use of "snares" of any kind for catching or killing fish has been prohibited. A future cadets entering the Royal Military College, Kingston, will be required to pay \$200 fee. This is just double the former amount. Those pupils who entered last September and were forced to pay the extra fee have been refunded the \$100 they paid over the old fee. Hon. Mr. Wark, the Liberal senator from New Brunswick, is the latest dissident from the party's policy of making Canada the fiscal vassal of Washington. The Opposition is hoing a very unprofitable row in New Brunswick, apparently.
