REIL'S DEATH.
Opinion of Mr. Tarte's Paper.
MONTREAL, Nov. 17.—The Patrie, Mr. Tarte's paper, takes advantage of the fact that yesterday was the thirteenth anniversary of the execution of Louis Reil, at Regina, to again raise the race question. It suffices to recall that Reil was executed after a judicial farce, and contrary to British tradition, that a political prisoner should not be hanged. The scaffold of 1885 was erected by the intolerance and hatred of the Orangemen, and by the bad elements that dominated the Tory party of that period."
