

Cheese Factories or Creameries

The Canadian Live Stock and Farm Journal for November, says: "The degree of profit that may be derived from the establishment of either of these in a district depends mainly on the nature of the husbandry followed, and the character of the land. If the majority of farmers follow mixed husbandry there is no doubt but the creamery would do best with them, for in the creamery system of management the skim milk is left on the farm to feed the poultry, pigs and calves. Under the system followed in the management of cheese factories, only a few of the patrons, those that are close to the factory, can obtain the whey, which to some extent may prove a substitute for the whole milk. In districts where the aspect of the land is rolling, the creamery will be found to give the best satisfaction, owing to the fact that it is much easier to draw the cream to the creamery than it would be to take the whole milk to the factory under such conditions. In districts that are low in fertility, that need feeding to make cultivation profitable, the creamery offers the best means of salvation, for in dairy farming under such conditions fertility is brought to the farm instead of being taken from it. On the other hand, the mainstay of the cheese industry is the greater profit, always certain, that is made by the patrons where the surrounding circumstances are at all suitable. This larger profit, which is always to be relied upon, owing to the steadiness of our cheese market, sweeps away all other arguments that may be advanced in favor of the creamery compared with the cheese factory.

Horse Notes.

The English horse St. Simon stands at \$1,300 and his book is full for three years to come. Speaking of stud fees brings to mind the fact that a rumor is being printed which states that Albrton's fee next season will be \$1,000. This is just twice what he stood for this year, and the full rate was not insisted on in every case.

A pacer that made a record of 2 1/4 at Independence the other day is Wilkie Russell, that is by Mambrino Russell, dam by George Wilkes. It was a striking coincidence that on the day Wilkie Russell made this mark the first colt he ever sired, very appropriately named Primus, came out in a race for two-year-old trotters and won a heat in 2:30 1/2, being taken back at the finish to such an extent that it was plain he could have beaten 2:30. Wilkie Russell is but five years old, and to have at that age a son capable of beating 2:30 is something not often seen.

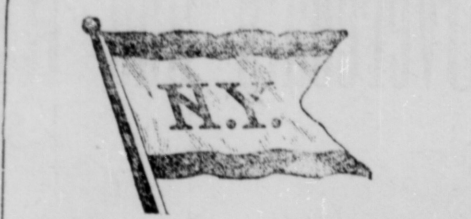

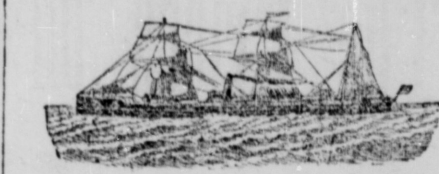
