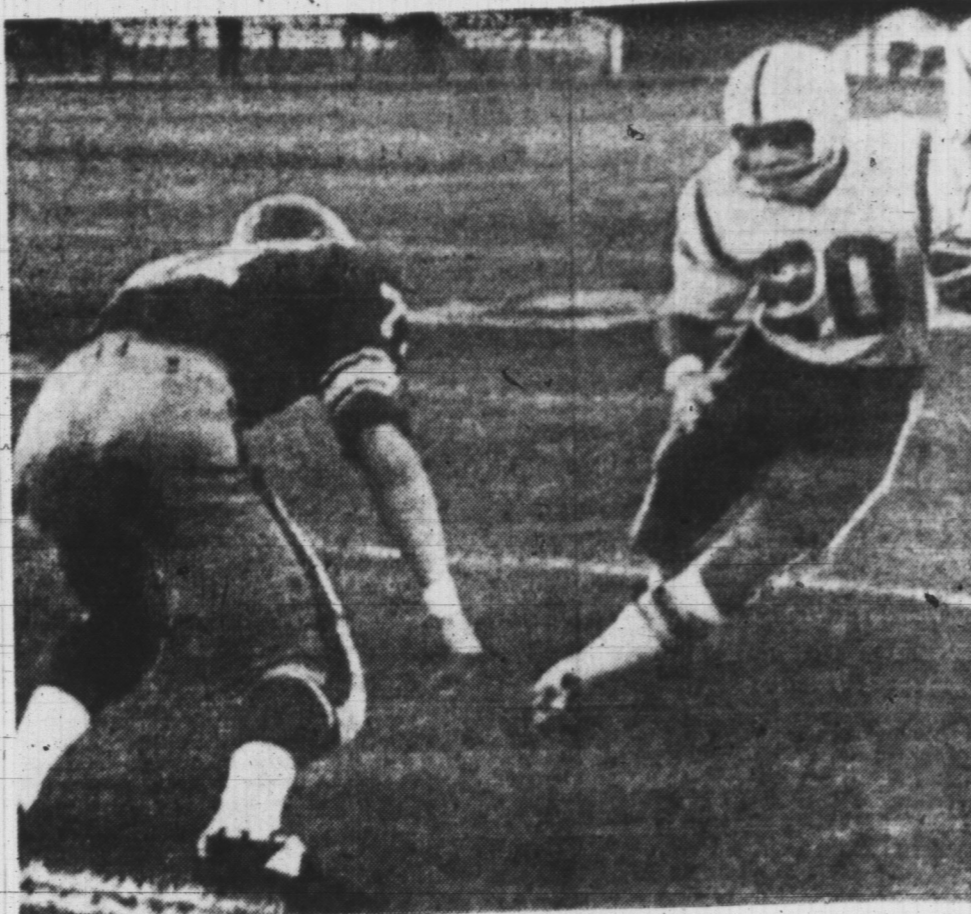
## REMEMBER WHEN

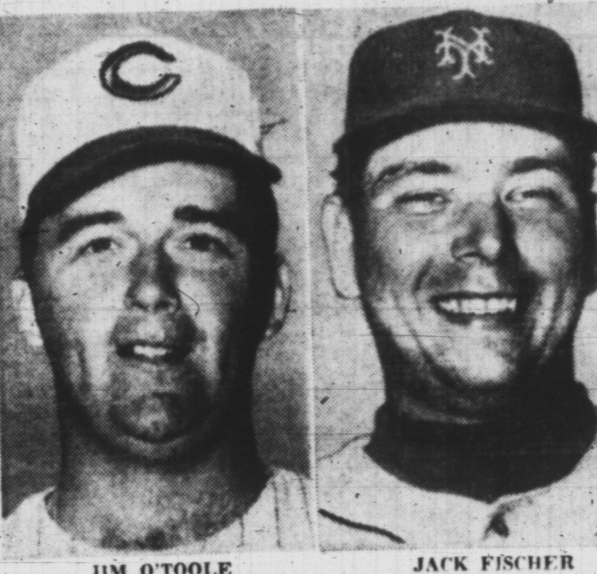
