

Massey Cancels Visit Due To Kidney Ailment

BATTERWOOD HOUSE, Port Hope, Ont. (CP)—Governor-General Vincent Massey has contracted a kidney infection and on the advice of his doctor has cancelled a visit to Vancouver and the north that was to have been his final trip while in office.

Lionel Massey, the Governor-General's son and secretary, announced Monday night that Mr. Massey is deeply disappointed at having to cancel the tour and asked that his regrets be expressed at the inconvenience caused his hosts and those making arrangements for the visits.

The illness struck Mr. Massey, 72, about a week ago. His temperature rose and his personal physician, Dr. Peter Burton of Ottawa, twice was summoned to his bedside at Mr. Massey's family home here.

SHOWS IMPROVEMENT
The Governor-General remained confined to bed and his temperature subsided Monday. He is expected to be well enough to spend an hour out of bed today.

The Governor-General's secretary said Mr. Massey is not in pain and is well enough to occupy himself with reading. He did some work in bed Monday.

Mr. Massey is understood to have hoped that the infection would be brought under control in time for him to leave as scheduled Wednesday for Vancouver.

However, he was persuaded by Dr. Burton that he should not tax his strength with so strenuous a program as a trans-continental flight and a northern tour.

The announcement from Mr. Massey's secretary said: "The Governor-General has contracted a kidney infection and has been told by his doctor that he must cancel his forthcoming tour of Vancouver and northwest Canada. His Excellency is deeply disappointed and regrets very much indeed the great inconvenience that this will cause his hosts and the many others who have worked so hard in the preparation of the tour."

ARCTIC TRIP
Mr. Massey, who relinquishes his post Sept. 15 to Maj.-Gen. George P. Vanier, was to have made a second trip inside the Arctic Circle after his B.C. visit.

In 1956 he made an extensive Arctic tour during which he crossed the North Pole by aircraft. This time he was to have visited Inuvik, a new townsite in the Mackenzie River delta near the Arctic coast.

Illness has rarely interfered with Mr. Massey's duties during the record 7 1/2 years he has been the sovereign's representative. He was forced to cancel the traditional New Year's Day levee in 1956 because of a severe chill and fever.

STILL FATIGUED
Following that illness, he carried out his scheduled January program, including functions planned as much as a year ahead. However, he still suffered from fatigue and again on the advice of his doctor took a three-week holiday in the sun in the West Indies where he celebrated his 71st birthday.

Later during 1956, he developed bursitis, a painful condition of the tendon and spent many weeks with his right arm in a sling. He wore the sling during the visit to Ottawa of Princess Margaret in August, 1956. Earlier this year he went to Montreal for treatment of the bursitis in his right shoulder.

Mr. Massey has travelled extensively throughout Canada since becoming governor-general. He logged close to 200,000 miles using every mode of travel from dog sled to aircraft.

BARELY EXPLORED
Several new species of birds have been found on New Britain Island, 35 miles east of New Guinea in the Bismark Archipelago.

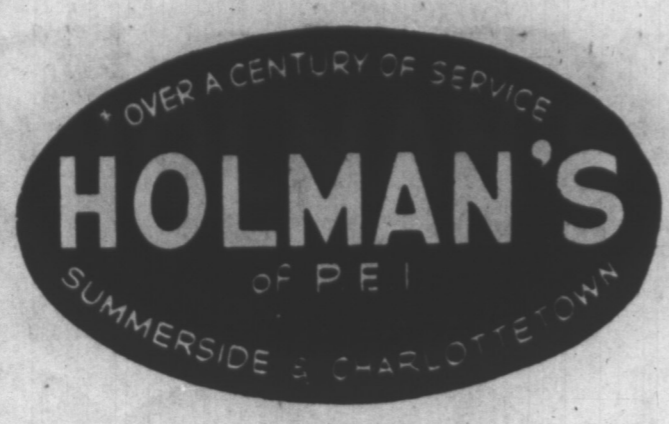
