

Support Is Developing For Allies N-Force

WASHINGTON (AP) — Formation of an "inter-allied nuclear force" advocated by the United States would give European NATO nations a much bigger voice in selecting atomic weapons targets behind the Iron Curtain, U.S. officials say.

State Secretary Rusk returned last week from consultations in Paris where an expanded plan for the inter-allied nuclear force was developed. It now appears to have gained considerable support.

One obvious purpose of the plan is to force some kind of link—if possible—between future French nuclear forces and those being developed in NATO with the U.S. as primary supplier of the nuclear bombs and warheads.

Rusk returned to Washington convinced that when France has built an independent nuclear force her strategic nuclear planning and weapons targeting will be co-ordinated with weapons deployed by the U.S. and other NATO allies.

Unless objections arise, the plan is due to be put into effect at a meeting of the North Atlantic Treaty Council at Ottawa next month.

Authorities here said it would have two quick practical results:

1. The strategic planning staff handling nuclear weapons problems in NATO headquarters would be expanded.
2. NATO liaison officers assigned to U.S. Strategic Air Command would be no longer be American exclusively as they have been in other weeks. Officers of other NATO governments will be brought directly into targeting work.

The result of such moves, the U.S. officials said, should be to give European NATO governments a much more realistic understanding of the problems involved in operating the nuclear deterrent force as well as the nature of potential nuclear warfare.

The United States began a year ago trying to give NATO governments information along this line as well as data on the cost of nuclear weapons in the delivery systems needed to make them effective.

TRY TO FORM LINKS
In reporting his appraisal during the weekend, U.S. officials made clear that in the meantime Rusk and other NATO leaders have been trying to find some way to construct transitional links within the alliance. A major aim would be to minimize the impact of the split between French President de Gaulle and other NATO leaders.

The substance of the new concept of the nuclear force seems to be to give the European allies a greater voice in targeting of nuclear weapons against potential enemy targets.

As one informant put it: "De Gaulle is not willing to put his nuclear eggs into the NATO basket. So the other NATO allies are now trying to build a nuclear basket under French noses."

The objective is to forge new unity in the alliance. Whether the plan will succeed no one here will predict. The French have not objected to it so far. The basic commitment of their forces in NATO which would be necessary for carrying out this concept has already been made.

The plan calls for treating as part of the inter-allied force all nuclear-armed forces in NATO which are capable of reaching beyond the immediate battle area in any future war. This is a projection of the U.S.-British multi-national force which grew out of the meeting between President Kennedy and Prime Minister Macmillan at Nassau last December.

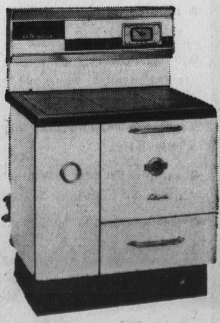

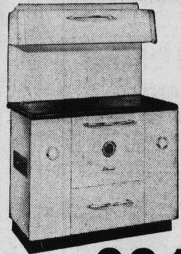
