ATHENS, Nov. 6 — (AP) — Premier Sophocles Venizelos said tonight that 57 military and 55 civilian prisoners captured by Communist guerrillas will be returned to Greece by Yugoslavia to-

Halifax Baseball League to Continue
HALIFAX, Nov. 7 — (CP) — The Halifax and District Baseball League will continue to operate under the Nova Scotia Amateur Baseball Association and will not join with organized professional ball, it was decided at the league's annual meeting here Saturday.
Delegates decided, however, to adopt one of pro ball's customs—a salary limit. Next season all six clubs—Halifax, Dartmouth, Liverpool, Stellarton, Truro and Kentville—will have a monthly salary limit of \$3,500 for a roster of 15 players. This will assist, they believe, in whittling deficits of the six-year-old circuit.
Harry Butler of Halifax was re-elected president with greatly increased powers. Jack Christian was re-elected league secretary-treasurer. The schedule will run from June 1 to Aug. 18 and final playoffs must be completed by Sept. 8. Each club must post a bond of \$1,000 before May 1 to guarantee that all players registered will remain until the end of the playoffs. Previously, imported college talent often before the season finished.
Other points accepted by the delegates were:
1. Any club violating the salary agreement will be fined \$200 for each violation and the players involved suspended.
2. The president will have complete jurisdiction in all matters of league policy, and the appointing of umpires.
3. If there is a tie for any of the first four positions, a coin will be tossed.
4. No player of any eliminated club will be allowed to join a club still in the playoffs.
Among delegates were: Clarence Johnson, M. T. MacInnis, Truro; Clary Potts, Bob Munro, Stellarton.

Lift Diplomatic Blockade of Spain
NEW YORK, Nov. 7 — (AP) — The United Nations Saturday lifted its diplomatic blockade of Franco Spain imposed four years ago.
Sweeping aside Soviet protests, the U. N. also voted to allow Spain to join U. N. specialized agencies such as the World Health and Postal Organizations.
The U. N. kept on the book, however, the 1946 denunciation of the Franco regime and the ban against Spain's full entry into the United Nations.
The roll-call vote in the U. N. Assembly was 38 in favor and 10 against a Latin-American resolution softening the restrictions. Twelve countries abstained. Canada supported the resolution although the Dominion has no diplomatic representative in Spain.
The assembly decision leaves it up to the members to decide for themselves whether to send their top diplomats back to Madrid. Similarly, it leaves it to the special U. N. agencies to vote on Spanish membership.
While the United States supported the resolution, President Truman told a press conference Thursday that it will be a long, long time before the U. S. sends an ambassador to Spain. The U. S. at present has a charge d'affaires in Madrid.
Some Latin-American countries already have established full-dress diplomatic relations with Spain, despite the 1946 U. N. embargo.
Reports from Madrid have described Spain as showing no enthusiasm about joining only special U. N. organizations. The Spanish press has clamored for full membership or nothing.

Lawyer Has Income Tax Case In Court
OTTAWA, Nov. 6 — (CP) — The Exchequer Court has begun hearing a case involving the income tax return of a member of the legal profession.
G. K. Daley, a Toronto lawyer, launched an appeal against a ruling of the Income Tax Appeal Board. The board rejected his claim that the \$1,500 fee he paid the Ontario Law Society on his transfer from Nova Scotia to Ontario was deductible for income tax purposes.
The board held that the fee represented a capital charge and could not be deducted for income tax purposes.
The case is due to resume tomorrow.


Toronto Woman 100 Years Old Yesterday
TORONTO, Nov. 7 — (CP) — Martha Harding, 100, yesterday said she doesn't do much else now but sit and eat at Belmont House, a home for the aged, where she has lived for 19 years.
Crippled by arthritis and with her sight and hearing dimmed by time, Miss Harding cannot read or listen to the radio.
But she has kept her mind sharp and her memories strong and, she gets up at six each morning because "there's no sense lying in bed is there?"

War Veteran Killed In Hunting Accident
LIVERPOOL, N.S., Nov. 7 — (CP) — Clyde Westhaver, 30-year-old war veteran, died yesterday from a bullet wound in the hip while on a hunting trip with two companions.
Westhaver was shot after he separated from his friends, Emile Gressaud and John Frank. An inquest will be held tomorrow.

Northwest Korea was the scene of the biggest aerial scrap since the first weeks of the war, with Russian-made Yaks battling to a draw with slower Yank planes. Flying through smoke-streak skies, U.S. F-51 Mustang fighters rescued an unarmed T-6 observation plane from six Russian-built Yak fighters. Four of the Mustangs shot down two of the Yaks, without a loss.


