TORONTO (CP)—Western oils
eased to within 12 cent points
of their highest index on record
Tuesday but the rest of the stock
market was irregular in moder-
ate trading.
Leading oil index winners
was Pacific Petroleum, up 1 1/2 points
to a new high of 36 1/4. North Canadian
jumped 70 cents to \$6 while
Fargo added 20 cents to \$9.20 and
Security 30 cents to \$6.70.
Iron ore and uranium stocks
were narrowly higher on the minute
list but lost ground.
International Nickel was up 1 1/2
points to 95 1/4. Acconic gained a
point to 13 1/2. Advocate was up 20
cents to \$6.70. Stanleigh Uranium
gained 20 cents to \$4.20.
Index changes: Industrials off
1.10 to 483.92; golds off .44 to 79.59;
base metals off .26 to 194.37; western
iron ore up 2.10 to 192.87.

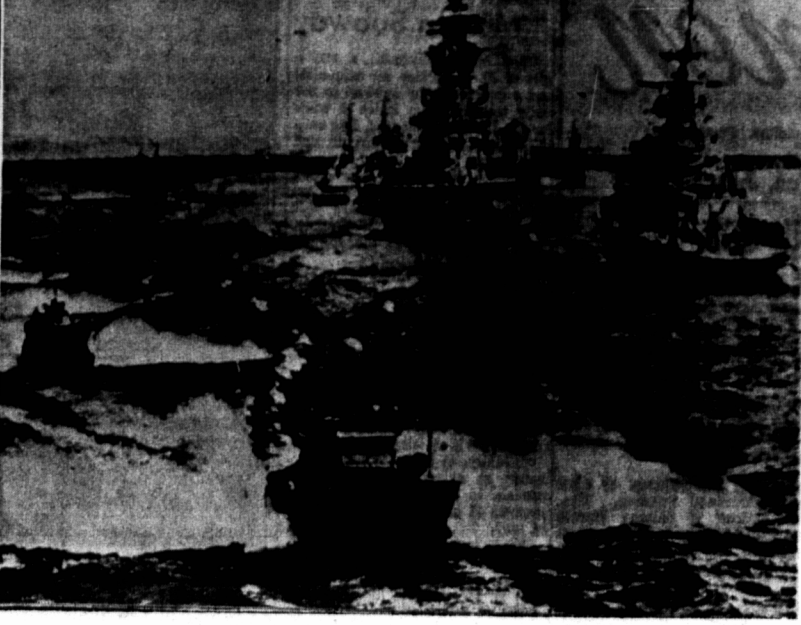
MONTREAL (CP)—Late industrial
improvements brought the
stock markets to a stronger tone
Tuesday despite earlier losses
which continued into closed
trading.
International Utilities led its
division with a 1 1/2-point gain at 68 1/2 while
Quebec Power at 32 and Southern
Canada power at 39 each ad-
vanced a point and 5/8. Dominion Steel
was up 1/2 at 75. Dominion Steel
was down a point at 28 1/2 and Al-
goma lost 1/4 at 38, while in the
refining oils International Petrol-
eum improved 3/4 at 52 1/2 and B.A.
was ahead 1/4 at 56 1/2.

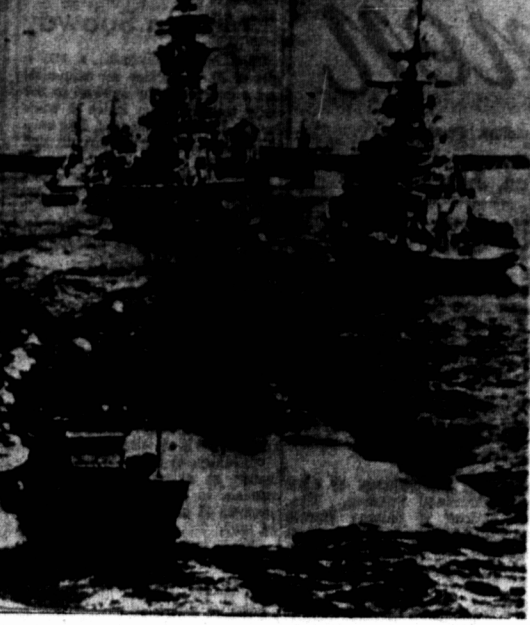
