Shippers and processors were buyers of oats and barley, while seaboard interests picked up flax. Shipper and American demand came out in rye.

Export loadings of Canadian wheat included 660,000 bushels for Japan, 365,000 each for United Kingdom and Chile, 305,000 for Germany and small lots for Belgium, Switzerland and Bolivia.

Class two wheat prices were up three-quarter cent from yesterday. I. W. A. prices dropped off one-quarter.

Halsey, Stuart & Co. Inc. is heading an underwriting group which is offering \$10,000,000 Province of New Brunswick 4 1/2 per cent New Sinking Fund De- bentures, due December 1, 1970 at 98.12 per cent and accrued interest.

Of the proceeds to be received from the sale of the debentures, \$2,950,000 will be used to repay bank loans incurred for the pay- ment of \$4,500,000 of Provincial debentures at maturity and \$2,250,000 will be used together with other funds of the Province to re- turn \$7,811,500 principal amount of the Province's outstanding debentures. Of the remainder of the proceeds, approximately \$2,500,000 will be advanced to The New Brunswick Electric Power Commis- sion in connection with its electric generating, transmission and dis- tribution system construction pro- gram and the balance will be ap- plied to the general capital pro- gram of the Province.

The debentures are redeemable at general redemption prices rang- ing from 103 1/2 to 100%. Through the sinking fund the debentures are redeemable at 100%.

New Brunswick is located east of the State of Maine and is the largest in area of the three Mar- itime Provinces of Canada. The Province has a total area of 27,985 square miles. Preliminary figures for the 1951 census show a popu- lation in the Province of 512,186.

Business Failures

OTTAWA, Dec. 6 —(CP)—Com- mercial failures increased to 312 in the third quarter of 1951 year from 248 in the corresponding period of 1950, and estimated liabilities rose to \$6,341,000 from \$5,798,000. The Bureau of Statistics re- ported today that failures during 1951's first nine months totalled 1,030, a rise of more than six per cent over the 968 recorded in 1950, and liabilities increased to \$18,595,000 from \$18,239,000. The average liability of bankrupt firms in the nine-month period amount- ed to \$18,063 as against \$18,842.

During the first nine months there were 435 instances of trading establishments as compar- ed with 377 in the similar period of 1950, an advance of more than 15 per cent. Failures in the con- struction field rose from 71 to 94. Defaults of manufacturing enter- prises were unchanged at 193. Failures of service businesses fell from 203 to 193.
