When Carl Livingston, Belvedere Heights, received his approved welder's certificate in April of this year he became, at 19, the youngest man on P.E.I. ever to receive the certificate. He is now an approved welder under the New Brunswick Boiler and Pressure Vessel Code, one of well over 100 Islanders who have been approved through an agreement between the provinces of P.E.I. and New Brunswick made about two years ago. Carl trained on the job at Ben Livingston and Sons Ltd., under his father and uncle who are qualified welders. He represents the third generation of his family in the welding trade. His grandfather, Ben Livingston Sr., has been a welder for about 40 years.

Carl has reached the second step toward becoming a qualified welder, with his approved certificate which requires three years' welding experience. The first step is class "B" welder, which can be reached after one year's training. After another year Carl may become a qualified welder. To obtain any of these certificates, the welder must pass a stiff practical test given by New Brunswick boiler inspectors.

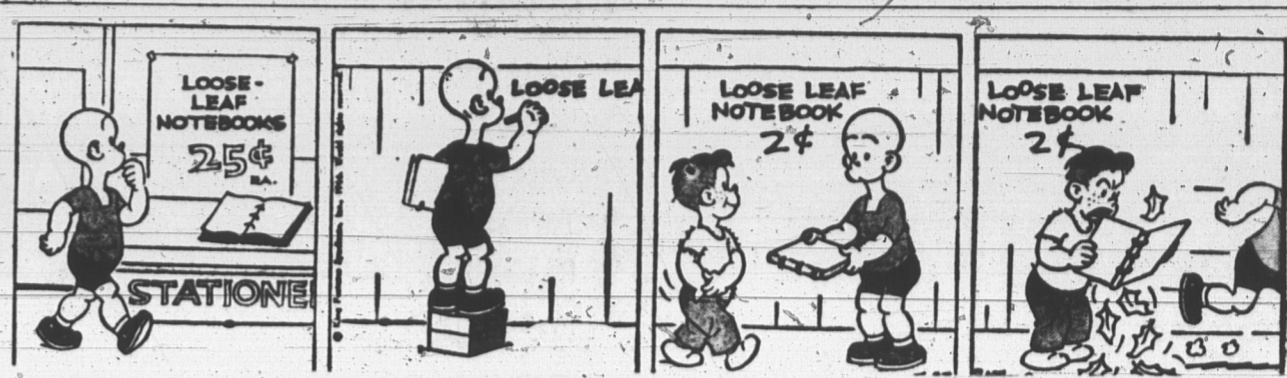
