

Senate Criticizes Student Loan Bill

OTTAWA (CP)—The government's student loan bill ran into a barrage of criticism in the Senate Monday, although most of the senators taking part in the debate said it should eventually be passed.

Most violent criticism of the bill, under which the federal government would guarantee interest-free bank loans to students, came from Sen. S. Thorvaldson (P.-Manitoba).

"I believe this bill is so bad, so irresponsible, so simply a vote-catching gimmick that it does not even deserve to go to a committee of the Senate."

The senator said the bill was a bad thing for Canadian unity in that it exaggerated the "opting out" formula for provinces, and that it would force the young people of the country, not only to pay for their education themselves but to contribute in one way or another to the cost of building the character of Canadian young people.

Consumers' Council Members Are Named

OTTAWA (CP)—The names of 14 women and two men who will make up the federal government's new advisory council of consumers were announced in the House of Commons Monday by Health Minister Judy LaMarsh.

The new council, which is to advise the government on all matters relating to the interests of the Canadian consumer, was first announced by Miss LaMarsh in a speech here to the Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs.

Chairman of the council is Dr. C. A. Morrell, 64, head of the health department's Food and Drug Directorate.

Mrs. A. F. W. Plumpton of Ottawa, national president of the 25,000-member Consumers' Association of Canada is among the 15 council members.

The other man on the council besides Dr. Morrell is a 35-year-old professor of pharmacy at the University of British Columbia, Modest Parnarowich of Vancouver.

Other members include house economist, a nutrition and biochemistry specialist and a number of prominent women in the Consumers' Association of Canada.

International Narcotics Probe To Get Underway This Week

WASHINGTON (AP)—The U.S. Senate investigation of narcotics will begin Tuesday a far-ranging investigation of the international narcotics trade and its operations in the United States and Canada.

Chairman of the subcommittee, John L. McClellan (Dem.-Ark.), asked federal narcotics commissioner Henry L. Giordano to lead off the testimony tracing the flow of illicit drugs from opium poppy fields in the Middle East and Far East to Western Hemisphere mobsters.

Much of the testimony is to centre on the big time narcotics traffic in New York City, Chicago, San Francisco, Los Angeles and across the United States, and in Quebec City, Montreal and Ottawa.

Subcommittee sources said evidence compiled by federal investigators and undercover agents for the U.S. narcotics bureau says will show inner workings of narcotics rings operating in Detroit, Philadelphia, Newark, N.J., San Antonio, Tex. and San Diego, Calif., and Washington, D.C.

"We will name the names of ring leaders," the committee's counsel Jerome S. Alderman told a reporter Tuesday, "and charts to be placed in evidence are expected to show ties between foreign and domestic mobsters in this hemisphere to virtually dominate the racket."
