

# Nine Dash Card To Go Tonight

SUMMERSIDE — Tonight at the Summerside Raceway 43 horses will see action in three double and three single dashes, and a winner in any of them will be hard to pick.

In race one, a single dash, which is also the first half of the daily double, eight evenly matched horses will face the starter.

Knight Norris, who hasn't been showing his old form this year, will likely be the sentimental favorite but Jolly Don on the rail and Future Chief trailing him will be real threats — the four mares in the race. Topsy Turvey, Miss Lane, Rose Alda Chief and Jolly May are always to be convinced as well as the lone trotter, Hettie's Boy.

The second half of the double will be a double dash race with the second time out being the quinella — fans will remember it was a seven horse field for the second time, that paid the \$600 — plus quinella some time ago, and in this field of three trotters and four pacers, it could easily happen again.

Fisherman's Luck, back on the trot again, Miss Tom Scott and Rio Grande will be against the pacers, Name the Price, Real Spirit, Silver Glengile, and Josedale Co-Pilot.

The two feature races will have fields of five and six horses.

In races three and seven, it will be Adioaway Logan, Doe Price, Adios Forever, Sunny Key, and Ohio's Orphan and in this field even a show ticket should pay well as these horses will be bet about even.

In races five and eight, George Calbeck's good four-year-old, Adioscot's Dream will be severely tested as he goes against the six best horses he has met to

date, he just nosed out Ripover in their last outing, Meadow Day and Timmy H have been "backed up a class". Highland Spirit and Echo Ridge Eddy have been very consistent of late, so Adioscot's Dream will have to be at his best to head this strong field.

The other two single dashes will both be exactors and any fan or bettor who can come up with the one-two in their fields should be well paid off.

Race four has eight trotters and — as trotters are unpredictable, two long-shots could easily finish first and second.

In the ninth race, a field of seven will battle it out. Not one of them have any advantage but post positions should count in the final outcome. However, Misty Paul and Captain Logan going out of three and five will be "breaking fast" and in the shuffle for positions out of the first turn, the race could take on a new aspect.

All in all, it looks as though it will be an evening of good betting and good racing.

DETROIT (AP) — Alex Delvecchio, a veteran of 15 seasons with Detroit Red Wings Tuesday became the first player to sign his 1966-67 contract with the National Hockey League club.

Red Wings manager-coach Sid Abel described the agreement as the 34-year old center's "best contract ever," but terms were not disclosed.

Delvecchio scored 31 goals last season and won his second Lady Byng Trophy for sportsmanship. He also won it in 1958-59.

## Marciano To Fight Again?

MILAN, Italy (AP) — Rocky Marciano, former world heavyweight boxing champion, said Tuesday he had been training for the last five months for a possible return to the ring.

But the 43-year-old American boxer added: "This possibility, however, is very faint."

Marciano, who retired undefeated from boxing 10 years ago, told reporters: "I have been cutting wood, shadow boxing and doing calisthenics for the past five months. I want to see how my body reacts to strain before deciding on any possible return to fighting."

His last fight was Sept. 21, 1955, when he knocked out Archie Moore in the ninth round of a title bout.

## G. s' Franks Is Rehired For 1967

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Manager Herman Franks, who has San Francisco Giants in the thick of the National League baseball pennant race, was rehired Tuesday for the 1967 season.

Terms were not disclosed, but club president Horace C. Stoneham said the 51-year-old manager would receive a pay increase. This would put him in the \$40,000 bracket.

As Franks' new contract was announced, the Giants were in third place, 2½ games behind Los Angeles Dodgers. A year ago, in Franks' first season as manager, San Francisco finished second to the Dodgers, two games behind.

Sutton has 12-11 record and has struck out 202 batters. Manager Walter Alton is expected to substitute with Joe Moeller, Bill Singer and Nck Willhite.
