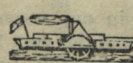

On Thursday, the 15th June, at 10 o'clock, the sum of 12l. for opening and repairing the Road leading from Buck's Road to Murray Harbour Road; at 12 o'clock, the same day, for the opening and repairing of M'Lean's Road, leading from Buck's Road to Murray Harbour Road, the sum of 10l.; also, at 2 o'clock, the sum of 7l., for repairing the Road on the South side of Montague River, from the old Bridge to M'Lean's; and at 4 o'clock, the same day, commencing at the 18-mile Brook Bridge, and let such parts of Road leading from thence to Georgetown as require repairing.

On Friday, the 16th June, at 12 o'clock, the sum of 20l. for the repairing the Streets of Georgetown and part of the Road through the Royalty.
