Drama Expert Coaches Local Amateur Players

"Canadians are certainly willing to support the theatre," said Mr. Graham Suter of London, Eng., this year's adjudicator of the Dominion Drama Festival who arrived in Charlottetown Saturday.

His stop here is a unique feature of his Canadian tour as Charlottetown is the only city where he is giving instructions on acting and directing, arranged by the Dominion Drama Festival.

Mr. Suter based his comments on experiences since his arrival in Canada on January 5, shortly after which he began adjudicating regional competitions for the Dominion Drama Festival in Hamilton, Ont., May 10-15.

He leaves Tuesday for Halifax, Fredericton and St. John's, Nfld., to adjudicate at their regional festivals.

He winds up on April 1 when he leaves for Hamilton to advise the Dominion Drama Festival committee of the eight finalists.

An experienced actor on stage, films and TV, a director, lecturer and broadcaster, he has been a member of the British Guild of Drama Adjudicators for the past five years.
