Whether singing of highwaymen or Irish rebels, of whiskey or romance, the Clancy Brothers and Tommy Makem could never be mistaken for anything other than what they are — Irishmen singing songs of their native land, songs they love, with the thick brogue and the rollicking wit one would expect to hear in Ryan's snug in O'Connell Street on a Saturday night.

One can tell these singers enjoy their work, and whether they are tripping light-heartedly through "The Moonshiners," or "Roinn na Bow," or singing of the sad destiny of their country in ballads of a more serious nature such as "The Rising of the Moon," or "The West's Awake," the honest emotion they generate comes through to the audience like waves beating on a shore.

Since they made their debut in New York City, the Clancy Brothers and Tommy Makem have been stopping shows in night clubs and concert halls all over the country.

These burly and charming Irishmen have captivated and delighted audiences from coast to coast in the United States and America's most sought after folk-singing attractions.

They appeal to young and old alike and, most likely, there are plenty of old-timers in Prince Edward Island who could turn a few bars of such old favourites as "The Whistling Gypsy," "The Rocky Road to Dublin," "A Jug of Punch," and most certainly of "Kevin Barry" if they had the chance to join in with the boys from the Old Sod.

The ballads of the Clancy Brothers and Tommy Makem echo the warm humanity of the folk who gave them birth and glow with humor. It is said they are better goodwill ambassadors of the Emerald Isle than Bushmill's — and this is high praise, indeed.

## Welfare Minister Pleased With Ottawa Talks Progress

SUMMERSIDE — The provincial Minister of Welfare and Labour, Hon. Hubert MacNeill, stated Monday he was quite pleased with the outcome of a two-day federal-provincial welfare conference which he attended in Ottawa recently along with Brigadier W.W. Reid, Deputy Minister of the department.

All ten provinces were represented as well as the Northwest Territories and the Yukon. "I feel the agreements reached at the conference will enable the provinces to develop more comprehensive and flexible programs which can provide aid to persons in need," Dr. MacNeill said.

Referring to the Canada Assistance Plan — the main topic during the two day session — Dr. MacNeill said one of the most important aspects is the provision in the plan for sharing within a single program, the cost of assistance to all people in need regardless of the cause of need. The plan has provision for the payment of assistance on the basis of a needs test rather than a means test as in previous plans.

## Campbell Hopes For Closer Ties

OTTAWA — A close connection is hoped to be maintained with the Federal Liberal Government for the benefit of Prince Edward Island, Provincial Liberal Leader Alex Campbell said here yesterday.

Spending several days in Ottawa to confer with federal ministers on Island problems, Mr. Campbell pointed out that P.E.I. has no representation in the federal cabinet and none in the House of Commons. All four Island seats were won by the Conservatives on November 8.

"Without discrediting the efforts the provincial government is making or the presence of our Island MPs in Ottawa, I feel there is a gap that needs to be filled in terms of communication with the federal government," Mr. Campbell explained. "I plan to keep in close touch with federal ministers and visit Ottawa frequently to discuss Island problems. I think I can help the province by maintaining these contacts on a party basis."

Mr. Campbell met Prime Minister Pearson, Agriculture Minister J. J. Greene, Forestry Minister Maurice Sauve, Public Works Minister George McNeil, ARDA director A.T. Davidson and Dr. E.P. Weeks of the Atlantic Development Board on Monday.

This morning he had meetings scheduled with five other ministers including Fisheries Minister Edgar Robichaud and then will attend the opening of Parliament this afternoon.

He said that in his discussions so far he has found a keen awareness of the Island and its aspirations among the federal cabinet.

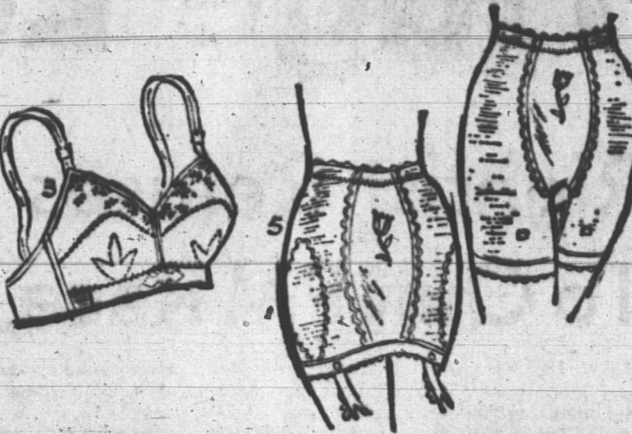

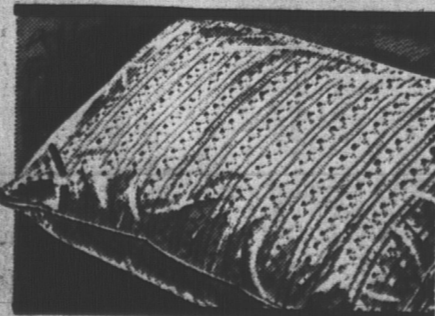

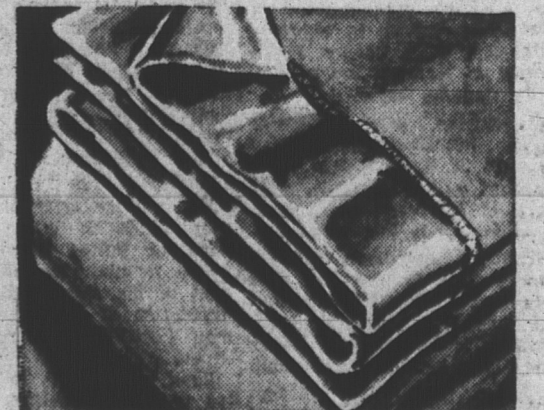
