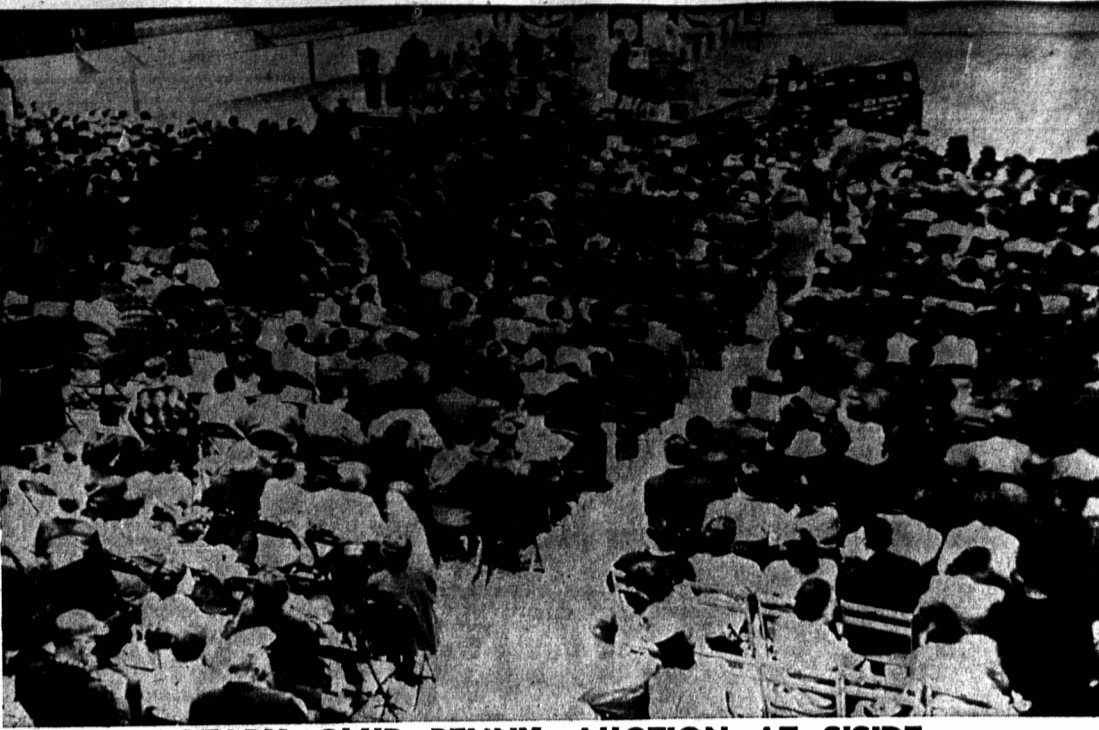

Navy League Scholarship To Negro Cadet

TORONTO (CP)—For the first time a Navy League of Canada scholarship has been awarded to a sea cadet who is a Negro. He is Lemuel Boyd of Edmonton, who will attend the University of Alberta, the navy league said Friday in announcing award of seven more university naval training division scholarships.

Last year Lemuel won the President's Trophy, awarded annually to the Canadian sea cadet who has shown the most outstanding qualifications for leadership. Other scholarship winners, with the universities they were attending include: David C. Kerridge, Sackville, N. B.; Dalhousie; Merrill R. Conrad, Bridgewater, N.S.; Acadia; Louis Seratti, New Victoria, N. S.; Xavier Junior College, Sydney, N. S.

Valued at \$250 each, the scholarships cover first-year tuition fees at universities and colleges. Capt. A. W. Police Release Two Peron Letters To Girl Friend

By SAM SUMMERLIN BUENOS AIRES (AP)—Argentine police made public Friday what they described as the story of Juan D. Peron's "intimate relations" with a teen-age brunette he wants to meet him in exile in Asuncion, Paraguay. The police released two letters from the fallen dictator, 60, to Neldita (Nelly) Haydee Rivas, 16, after a raid on her suburban Buenos Aires home. Authorities said they found \$23,000 worth of jewelry and \$22,000 in cash in the home of the girl, sexy-looking daughter of a janitor.

The story of Peron's romance was the most amazing revelation of his activities by investigators for the new revolutionary government who daily are unearthing new evidence against him and his 10-year regime.

UNKNOWN TO PUBLIC Police said the romance began before 1953—indicating it bloomed not long after the death July 26, 1952, of Peron's blonde wife, Eva.

In one of the letters Peron addressed Neldita as "my dear child" and signed off "your daddy." The romance was carefully shielded from the public. She sometimes stayed overnight at the official presidential residence, police said, and Peron at times introduced her as his niece.

Persons who have seen Neldita described her as "a petite brunette, not beautiful but sexy" with a whistle-provoking figure.

LETTERS INTERCEPTED The police said Neldita's family was aware of her relationship with Peron. The ex-president gave her a house only 12 blocks from his suburban residence in the

Police Release Two Peron Letters To Girl Friend

By SAM SUMMERLIN BUENOS AIRES (AP)—Argentine police made public Friday what they described as the story of Juan D. Peron's "intimate relations" with a teen-age brunette he wants to meet him in exile in Asuncion, Paraguay. The police released two letters from the fallen dictator, 60, to Neldita (Nelly) Haydee Rivas, 16, after a raid on her suburban Buenos Aires home. Authorities said they found \$23,000 worth of jewelry and \$22,000 in cash in the home of the girl, sexy-looking daughter of a janitor.

The story of Peron's romance was the most amazing revelation of his activities by investigators for the new revolutionary government who daily are unearthing new evidence against him and his 10-year regime.

UNKNOWN TO PUBLIC Police said the romance began before 1953—indicating it bloomed not long after the death July 26, 1952, of Peron's blonde wife, Eva.

In one of the letters Peron addressed Neldita as "my dear child" and signed off "your daddy." The romance was carefully shielded from the public. She sometimes stayed overnight at the official presidential residence, police said, and Peron at times introduced her as his niece.

Persons who have seen Neldita described her as "a petite brunette, not beautiful but sexy" with a whistle-provoking figure.

LETTERS INTERCEPTED The police said Neldita's family was aware of her relationship with Peron. The ex-president gave her a house only 12 blocks from his suburban residence in the
