# Terry Sawchuk Sets Mark With Most NHL Shutouts

MONTREAL (CP) — Terry Sawchuk, some of his work being on sheer theory, set an all-time record for shutouts in the National Hockey League when his Detroit Red Wings upended Montreal Canadiens 2-0 Saturday night before 14,522 fans.  
The Red Wings rode to the win on Sawchuk's 26-save performance. Floyd Smith's seventh goal of the season and no. 8 of the campaign for Eddie Joyal.  
It was the fourth shutout in the current schedule for Sawchuk and his 19th going back to the 1949-50 season. That

pushed him ahead of the lifetime mark he shared with George Hainsworth of another hockey era.  
Hainsworth was killed in an automobile accident Oct. 15, 1950, the night Sawchuk was playing his second game as Detroit's goaltender.  
Temperamental Terry drew even with Hainsworth's feat with a 2-0 job on the Canadiens no. 10 in Detroit when his teammate Gordie Howe potted goal no. 34 to smash Maurice Richard's lifetime scoring mark.  
STRATEGY FAILS  
Saturday night, driven by embarrassment, coach Toe Blake of the Canadiens took a desperation step to prevent the Wings from setting another record against his club. Although down 2-0 in the last minute of play, he lifted goalie Charlie Hodge for a sixth attacker. But it didn't work.

It was undeniably Terry Sawchuk's night and he gave a flawless display. Everything the Canadiens did Terry seemed to have anticipated. In classic leg-kicking style, he stopped at least three breakaways, smothering John Ferguson, Bobby Rousseau and Jean-Guy Talbot.  
To hold off an attack as intense as the one Montreal hurled at him took more than a dash of luck and Sawchuk had that, too. Once the puck came off his shoulder, struck the goalpost and bounded clear, in another goalmouth melee, Gilles Tremblay only had to judge the puck over the fine with his stick. The way was unimpeded. But a Detroit player and one of Tremblay's teammates were sprawled across him and he was unable to shake his stick free.  
In the second period the game was delayed after Sawchuk had

the wind knocked out of him when struck by Ferguson's stick. But the 36-year-old native of Winnipeg did not require clinical treatment and play resumed after a four-minute interruption.  
The last time Detroit played here, Dec. 26, 1963, Sawchuk came within less than three minutes of his record-breaking shutout. A goal by Rousseau at 17:02 of the final period spoiled things and the wings salvaged a 1-1 tie.  
Similarly, Saturday night they carried a 1-0 edge into the third period. But this time Joyal's eighth goal of the season—35 seconds after the period opened—changed the script. He dumped Doug Barkley's pass behind Hodge while standing at one corner of the crease.  
Smith counted on an angled footer along the ice at 11:44 of the first period after taking Norm Ullman's pass. It was his seventh goal of the campaign.  
Hainsworth established his shutout mark in 10½ seasons with the Canadiens and Toronto Maple Leafs after the Second World War. The string included 22 shutouts in 44 games in 1928-29.

## O'Leary Maroons To Meet Juniors

SUMMERSIDE — The Junior Legionnaires play their sixth game in as many days tonight when they travel west to take on the O'Leary Maroons. Game time is 8:30 p.m.
