### Island Presbytery Names 11 To Special Committee

The Presbytery of Prince Edward Island has named 11 representative ministers and laymen to serve on a committee which will elect a Board of Directors for the Presbyterian Extension Fund (Atlantic) Ltd.

The committee will act in conjunction with six other Presbyteries of the Synod of the Maritime Provinces. The extension corporation is presently being incorporated in Nova Scotia and will be registered in each of the three other Atlantic Provinces.

The corporation, similar to other corporations set up in each of the eight Synods of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, has as its sole purpose the raising of funds and the securing of plans for church extension.

The action was taken at the presbytery meeting in the Kirk of St. James hall on Tuesday. The Moderator of the Presbytery, the Chair, with the Clerk, Rev. T.H.B. Somers, at the desk. The following Ministers were also present: Rev. D.A. Campbell, Rev. Donald Nicholson, Rev. J.D. MacKay, Rev. M.C. Currie, Rev. L.M. MacNaughton, Rev. George Killen, Rev. Chas. Townsley, and Rev. J.Y. Garrett of Alberton. Mr. R.D. Bhe, student pupil supply at Brookfield was welcomed as a visitor to the Court. Elders present included Howard Clark, Frank MacDonald, Murdoch MacGowan, B.P. McLaine, Francis Murray, J.A. MacKinnon, Chas. Phillips, H.B. MacLeod, Daniel Shaw, and Wm. Kennedy.

**MAKES APPEAL.** The Presbyterian Deacons Training School is making a Canada-wide appeal for \$250,000 for a new building and a Presbytery Committee consisting of Rev. E.L. Bean, B.P. ### TRAINING SCHOOL

Reports of property improvements were heard from Caledonia, Wood Islands, Brookfield, Hunter River, North Tryon, New London, and Alberton. A training school for youth workers is to be held in New Glasgow on November 20th, Rev. D.A. Campbell announced, and the Fall Rally of young people's societies of the Presbytery is to be held in Montague on November 11th.

Reporting on Camps, Rev. E.H. Bean stated that a total of 139 campers had been in attendance at Camp Keir this summer along with a staff of 22. All bills have been paid and a balance is in the bank. Wm. MacKenzie of Flat River was appointed to serve on the Synod Men's Council in place of Ralph Balderson. J.C. Mountain is the other representative from this Presbytery on the Synod Council of Presbyterian Men.

The General Assembly has declared that the basic stipend for all Ministers should be \$3,900, plus manse, plus travel allowance. The Court therefore directed the Clerk to write all the self-sustaining Congregations in the realization of this goal, asking that an increase to \$3,600 be made at once and an annual increase of \$100 be made until the authorized stipend is reached.

### Waited For End Almost Six Days Behind Huge Rockfall

SPRINGHILL, N. S. — (CP) — Here's how 12 men given up for dead were found alive in the Cumberland mine Wednesday. Deep in a working area 13,000 feet from the mine entrance the men waited for the end. They had been there almost six days behind a rock wall.

The men inside heard a noise. They thought they saw a light. They shouted and tapped on a broken pipe but got no response. Percy Weatherbee heard a noise. He thought it was a voice. He looked and saw the end of a pipe. A voice seemed to come from that.

### Money In Bank No Fun, Is View Of Adventurer

EDMONTON (CP)—Dick Strazer, an adventuresome businessman who at 32 is well on his way toward his first million, says "there's no fun in keeping money in the bank."

He's trying to keep his busy, currently in a new transportation enterprise on the Mackenzie River in Canada's northwest—in spite of a fire in the lonely Arctic which all but wiped out the company's assets.

"We'd tied up the barges on the tip of Alaska nearest Siberia, getting ready for the trip through the Bering Sea and along the Arctic coast," he said in an interview. "Somebody used gasoline in one of the stoves. That was it. The Eskimos were mightily impressed."

Mr. Strazer's plans to launch the barges of his Edmonton-based Mackenzie Transportation Company on the waters of the broad northern river evaporated in the sheet of flame.

The fire cost us \$30,000 and a summer's work but then, those Eskimos were sure impressed," said the American-born Mr. Strazer.

Now he is in Salt Lake City investigating a fleet of huge steel barges as possible replacements for those lost in the fire.

"We'll either knock 'em down, reassemble them at Portland and tow them up the coast in the spring, or we'll ship them by rail and truck to Great Slave Lake," he said. "With a little luck, Mackenzie Transportation will be in business by spring."

**QUICK SUCCESS STORY**  
Mr. Strazer's vault into the northern transportation business is the latest chapter in a remarkable success story.

In 10 years, this tough-minded, brainy adventurer has parlayed a fish peddler's truck into a widening empire of explosive, oil and hotel interests worth hundreds of thousands of dollars.

Ten years ago, while on his way to Alaska, the rear end dropped out of Mr. Strazer's ancient car near the hamlet of Valleyview in the Peace River country of Alberta. He couldn't afford repairs, so took a job as a mechanic in the garage where his car was stranded.

In a few months, he had the down payment for a half-ton truck. He bought fish from commercial fishermen on Lesser Slave Lake and peddled it to northern farmers.

With an eye to the high price of eggs in Alaska, he bought a larger truck and toted eggs over

the 1,500-mile Alaska Highway to Fairbanks and Anchorage.
