

Proposed Trinidad Oil Co. Sale Sparks Opposition

LONDON (Reuters) — The government, in face of strong parliamentary protests, announced Thursday that it is willing to let American interests buy the British-owned Trinidad Oil Company under certain conditions.

Wilson said a chief reason for American interest in the Trinidad Oil Company is its holdings in Canada and the change for expansion there.

These are: 1. Operations will be carried out by a company registered in Trinidad. 2. The American company must undertake to operate the Trinidad refinery at full economic capacity and extend it as possible.

3. Marketing arrangements will ensure that all sold to the sterling area will be paid for in sterling not dollars. 4. Exploration for oil in Trinidad will be intensified.

NO STOCKS RUSH The government's announcement brought a great rush of business on Trinidad shares in the stock markets here. Most speculators had anticipated the government would agree to the deal.
