THE ASYLUM MATTER.

SIR,—I have been greatly impressed by your remarks about the importance of the constant attendance of the medical superintendent upon curable patients at the Hospital for the Insane, and have made some enquiries as a result of which I learn, with great surprise, that Dr. Blanchard is not a constant attendant at the hospital, even in the daytime. On some days, I am told (though not by a member of the staff), that the doctor never puts in an appearance at all. Perhaps you can say whether or not this is true. The public has these lunatics on its hands, and I agree with you that if they are neglected or kept overcrowded in the hospital building the responsibility lies, at the last, with the public. Certainly the public ought to look after its representatives and officers. I am greatly surprised at the conduct of Mr. Warburton in this matter, for I always thought him a man of kind heart and generous impulses. How it is that he is not going on with the Asylum annex is a mystery to me. But I suppose he is hampered by the jealous politicians. Mr. Lowe's letter, which I have read very carefully, seems to show that Messrs. Farquharson and Bell are the blocks in the way. If that should prove to be so, it will be the worse for them.
