Alex Colville Is Speaker At Art Society Meeting Tonight

The Prince Edward Island Art Society will welcome as their guest for the monthly meeting tonight the internationally recognized artist Alex Colville. The general public to share the evening with members.

Mr. Colville will speak of current trends in Canadian art and his own technique in particular, illustrating his talks with slides of his work. The meeting will be held in the Library at Montgomery Hall.

Alex Colville was born in Toronto in 1928. He spent his youth in St. Catharines, Ontario, and in Amherst, Nova Scotia. After a period of study at the Mount Allison University School of Art he became official war artist, illustrating the Canadian Army and Navy in the Mediterranean and northern Europe. Since 1946 he has taught at Mount Allison.

Art critics, with the interested public in pursuit, find it useful to label artists, to classify their work so that they can be identified with a school or group of certain techniques. Mr. Colville has been linked with several post-war Canadian artists, Jean-Paul Lemieux, Good-

ridge Roberts, Kenneth Lockhead and Jack Shandoff, for example, who have a more subjective, a more personal and intimate relationship with their material than had their predecessors, the Group of Seven. It has been said that Canadian art is no longer linked to Canadian geography as it was when vast horizons, the fir and pine and rock-fringed woods and lakes provided the inspiration. For Colville landscape is a pale backdrop. In the foreground are his figures - intensely, dramatically alive, the label the critics have given his work is "magical realism".

Mr. Colville has paintings in Galleries across Canada. His work was selected to hang with that of 22 others in the Canadian pavilion at the International Exhibition in Brussels a few months ago. He is represented with 14 of his Canadian contemporaries in the exhibition at the Polanski Gallery. This show unanimously impressed Polish art critics who were asked to express their surprise and pleasure that Canada could mount such an exhibition.
