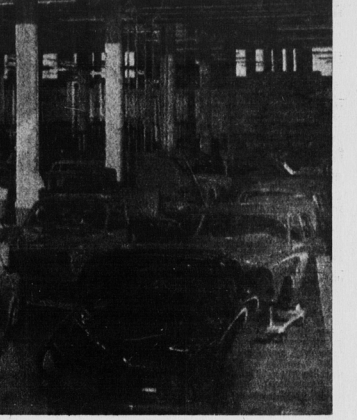

### Medical Association Plans Cigarette Warning Drive

TORONTO (CP)—The Canadian Medical Association, Tuesday, launched a major campaign to warn the public against the hazards of smoking cigarettes.

The doctors will ask the federal government to consider legislation requiring cigarette manufacturers to put labels on the packages warning that the product is dangerous to health.

The CMA will approach the federal government to request a similar regulation of cigarette advertising pending discussion on the cigarettes-lung cancer problem among all interested parties at a national conference suggested by federal Health Minister Jean Marchand.

Representatives of 16,500 doctors across Canada approved in general council a plan of attack designed to curb lung cancer by seeking educational action through federal, provincial and municipal governments, schools, advertisers and advertising media.

The doctors were asked to discourage cigarette smoking, particularly by setting a non-cigaretted example themselves. The CMA will approach the federal government to request a similar regulation of cigarette advertising pending discussion on the cigarettes-lung cancer problem and that there is a definite relationship between cigarette smoking and the disease.

A general Secretary A. D. Kelly of Toronto said the CMA "won't have to knock too hard on the door of the minister of health and welfare because she has recently given evidence that she has knowledge of the problem and expressed concern."

Miss La Marsh mentioned the cigarette-cancer problem in a speech at Hamilton Saturday, saying a national conference of medical experts and manufacturers should be called to discuss the problem. The plan of CMA action followed the lines of a report drawn up and first published in April by a CMA committee headed by Dr. R. K. MacGe of Peterborough.

WANT LAW ENFORCED  
The brief to the federal government will request action enforcing the law against selling cigarettes to children under 18 in addition to the requests for a ministerial warning and consideration of requiring warning labels on cigarette packages.

Asked why the doctors decided against seeking restraint of cigarette advertising, members of the cancer committee indicated their first aim was to speak amicably with the tobacco industry and advertisers. Dr. J. O. Godden of Toronto, a member of the cancer committee, said the CMA sees its primary task as educating the public.

### Controversial 'Youth Serum' May Be Tried On 300 Aged

TORONTO (CP) — A medically controversial "youth serum" may soon be tried on 300 residents of Toronto's Home for the Aged, the Ontario Geriatrics Research Society announced Tuesday.

The serum — pro-gerone hydrochloride — was first tried by a Rumanian woman doctor, and it has been claimed that it has been claimed that Dr. Anna Aslan of Bucharest first used it and she claims it stimulates the sex, adrenal and thyroid glands, and has preservative and rejuvenating effects on the whole body.

Called ELIXIR

Mrs. Theresa Priddle, chairman of the provincial minister of welfare's advisory committee on old age, said the province would cost an estimated \$13,000. A total of 600 persons aged 65 or over will be allowed to receive the elixir, but only 300 will get the drug. The remainder will be given injections.
