Men Who Died For Canada Are Remembered Sunday

The men who died for Canada in war will be remembered in services across the country Sunday.

Regular armed forces, militia and Royal Canadian Legion members will march to cenotaphs for the traditional placing of wreaths and dedication services to the memory of Canada's fallen.

A survey by The Canadian Press indicates most service parades will be held Nov. 11, but since Remembrance Day falls on a Sunday this year some British Columbia communities have parades scheduled for Monday.

British Columbia was the only province to declare Monday a legal holiday, giving a day off to civil servants, store employees and school children.

Federal civil servants, with the exception of post office and customs employees, will be on holiday throughout the country Monday.

New Brunswick provincial employees and school children also will have Monday off, but banks, stores and offices in

most communities will remain open. Alberta and Saskatchewan civil servants can sleep in Monday, while children in both provinces hike off to school.

Except for B.C. stores in all provinces will be open Monday, although some municipal governments have declared civic holidays or left it to individual storeowners to decide whether each will close.

Remembrance Day falling on a Sunday—as it did also in 1945 and 1951—has caused consternation in at least one city.

In Hamilton the civic remembrance service will be held at 11 a.m., the same time as most regular church services, and the Hamilton Council of Churches refused to support the civic service.

J. J. Dowd, one of the civic service organizers, said:

"The council feels that the civic service conflicts with church services, and the veterans feel that the service has to be held at the 11th hour of the 11th day in order to mean something."

Member churches of the

council plan to hold remembrance services at their regular Sunday services. Civic service organizers obtained two ministers by appealing directly to them.

In Ottawa, timing of a parade of about 1,100 servicemen, veterans and cadets was changed from the usual 11 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., so it would not conflict with Sunday church services.

Following the tribute of two minutes silence, Governor-General Vanier will place the first wreath at the National War Memorial.

St. John's West Seat Is Declared Vacant

OTTAWA (CP) — The St. John's West seat in the Commons, won by 24 votes in the June 18 general election by Liberal Richard Caslin, Thursday was declared vacant with receipt of a court judgment delaying the election void.

Speaker Marcel Lambert informed the Commons he had issued his writ to Chief Electoral Officer Nelson Castonguay to prepare for a new election to fill the vacancy.

Mr. Caslin won the election on the basis of the armed forces vote which upset the civilian vote won narrowly by former Solicitor-General J. William J. Browne. Then Mr. Browne protested under the Controverted Elections Act that servicemen

not entitled to vote in the riding had cast ballots, and two justices of the Newfoundland Supreme Court declared the election void.

Issuance of the Speaker's writ means the government must decide within six months the date for a by-election to fill the vacancy, but the date can be set within or beyond the six-month limit.

The vacancy reduces Liberal membership in the 265-seat Commons to 99 from 100. Other party standings are Progressive Conservative 116, Social Credit 50, New Democratic Party 19.

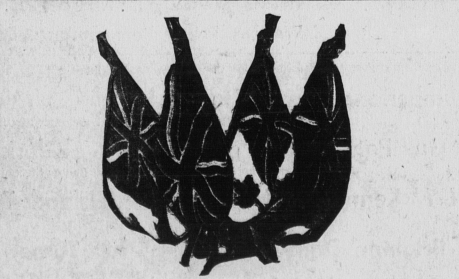

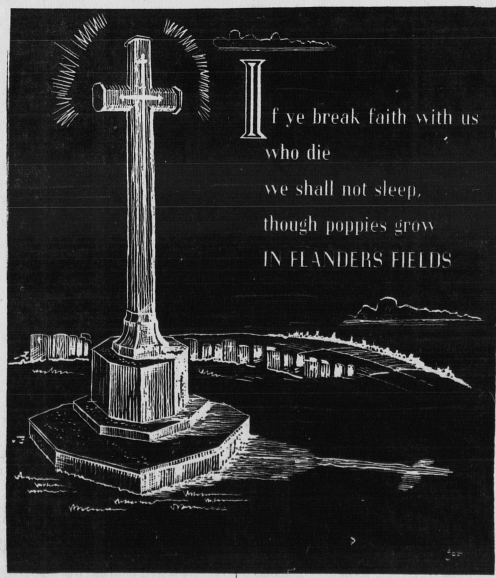
