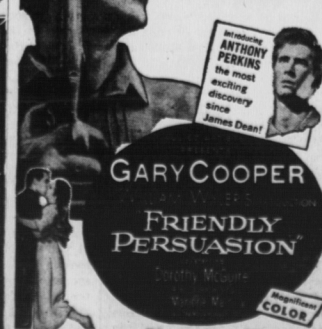

Red Cross Training Centre Program Details Outlined

Details of the program for the High School Red Cross Training Centre to be held at Montgomery Hall in Charlottetown, July 2 have been announced by Mrs. W.W. Reid, director of Junior Red Cross for P.E.I., who has arranged for the first leadership course to be held here in August.

The agenda lists some very prominent Red Cross personnel as speakers among whom will be Herbison C. Bastis of Toronto, the assistant national commissioner of the Canadian Red Cross Society. Mr. Bastis has travelled extensively in connection with his work in disaster and international relief projects. He will bring to the conference a wealth of background and practical experience as the representative of the League of Red Cross Societies during such disasters as the earthquakes in Chile, and the uprisings in Hungary and the Congo. He will speak on the need for international help and understanding.

Another special guest will be Ralph E. Woodhouse, recently appointed national director of the Canadian Junior Red Cross. Mr. Woodhouse, a native of Manitoba, is a former school teacher who later specialized in the field of health, physical fitness and guidance.
