

One More Sad Mystery.

THE STRANGE ACTION OF A TALENTED AND HIGHLY CONNECTED YOUNG LADY—SEARCHING IN VAIN FOR THE MISSING ONE.

After three weeks' search, the St. Louis police confess themselves baffled about the disappearance of Miss Mary Jones. The young lady is well known in St. Louis, and is highly connected, having relatives in various parts of the State.

THE VALEDICTORIAN of the class, the young lady, having developed musical talent of a high order, came to St. Louis, and was under the instruction of the Epstein brothers for quite a period.

A GOOD-BYE LETTER. Last month she again complained of her eyes, and another trip to St. Louis was planned, but temporarily given up.

"I leave to-night. I cannot wait for your opinion. I hope your prayers will follow my wandering feet. I will not have time to find Mrs. M."

There was no signature; but a simple dash of the pen. In another of the letters she told a friend how tired she was of Poplar Bluff, and how she longed to get away.

THE DEPARTURE PLANNED. She selected her clothing with care, laying aside her party dresses, and some trinkets. With a well filled trunk she left Poplar Bluff on the night train.

NO CLUES. There the trail breaks off abruptly. It has been learned that she checked out her trunk at the depot, but nobody there can remember whether it was taken into the city or went out by cars.

RELATIVES HAVE BEEN WRITTEN to but none of them have heard of the missing lady. Judge Sherwood and his wife are in the city, and also Mr. Wear. As a last resort they have had several hundred photographs and descriptive circulars printed, and these will be sent in every direction.

THE PERSONAL APPEARANCE is set forth as follows: "Twenty-six years of age, mediumly-dark hair, sallow or pallid complexion, eyes grey, very clear, with swollen appearance of under lid, nose thin and delicate, small mouth, except when laughing, then it spreads over the teeth; the eye-teeth a little projecting at the gums; the front teeth are filled with gold from the inside, the filling showing through between them; square flat chin, with red pimples on it, small bony neck, slender figure, shoulders a little stooped, weight 106 pounds; high, broad forehead, with blue veins very plain under the skin at the temples; at one temple, near eyebrow, a small mole, with white fibrous hair growing out of it, about the size of a large pin;

hands thin, blue veins very apparent, finger joints large. The forehead is broad, the rest of the face tapering to the chin; thin, flat cheeks. Had on when she left a garnet straw hat, with feather of same color; light grey, close-fitting jacket, crocheted edge, black dress; a gold watch-chain, twisted like a cord, worn round neck to gold watch; breast-pin, gold bar with shell in centre with a pearl set in it; ear-rings, gold ball pendants; on left fore finger a heavy plain gold ring, and a ring with garnet set in pearls worn before it. She is 5 feet 4 inches high; had garnet cloth hand-bag; russet leather trunk, wooden strips running lengthwise."

THE DESCRIPTION was very meagre. There is still a slight, lingering hope that she will be found to have immured herself from the world in some institution.

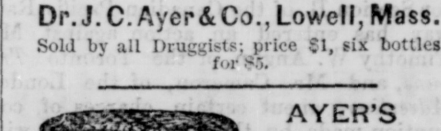
