

CCF Nominates Woman Candidate In Prince County

Mrs. Muriel MacInnis of Borden, provincial secretary-treasurer of the C.C.F. Party was nominated as the C.C.F. candidate for Prince County at a nomination convention Thursday evening. It preceded a public meeting in Civic Auditorium which was addressed by C.C.F. national vice-president Madam Therese Casgrain.

Douglas MacFarlane, president of the Provincial C.C.F. Council presided.

Mrs. MacInnis' nomination was proposed by Cyrus Gallant, Wellington, Provincial vice-president for Prince, seconded by Miss Carrie Holman, Summerside and supported by J. Harrison MacFarlane, Fernwood.

ACCEPTANCE
In accepting the nomination Mrs. MacInnis said "I will be very proud to carry the C.C.F. banner, anytime, anywhere."

Before introducing Madam Casgrain, Mrs. MacInnis related a short biography of the distinguished visitor who she said was a tenth generation Canadian born into a political atmosphere. Her father was a Conservative M.P. Later her husband was a Liberal M.P. Madam Casgrain spoke of the apathy among Canadians especially in larger cities. She stated that Canada is in a period of great development but stressed that almost forty per cent of the national income is going into war preparations. She spoke of a recent visit to India and of the hardships suffered by millions in that country.

SAME OPPORTUNITY
"I was blessed with four children and I had the means to give them food, clothing and education. The reason I joined the C.C.F. Party was that I felt every Canadian child should have an opportunity to give their children the same as I was able to give them."

She condemned "The miserly health plan" that the Government is proposing on the eve of an election, the closure method used in Parliament during the pipeline is-

MacNaught Opens Campaign At Meeting In Tignish Hall

Mr. J. Watson MacNaught, Parliamentary assistant to the Minister of Fisheries and Liberal candidate for Prince County in the June 10th Federal election, opened his campaign for re-election in Tignish last night where he addressed a well attended meeting in the Legion Hall.

Mr. MacNaught, who was introduced by the chairman, Hon. J.A. Bernard, reviewed briefly what the government has done for the farmers and fishermen mentioning such benefits as insurance on lobster boats and traps and unemployment insurance for fishermen, family allowances, increased old age benefits and veterans pensions and a year around tariff on importation of potatoes into Canada.

"I do not believe in going around the country making promises but if re-elected I promise to continue to give good government," Mr. MacNaught said.
