FARMER OWNED

Less than four weeks ago Farmers Allied Meat Enterprises Cooperative Ltd. completed the purchase of the F. W. Fearman Company Ltd. meat processing plant near Hamilton.

The sale price has not been disclosed. When completed in 1962, cost of the plant and site was said to have been \$2,000,000. The plant is one of the most up to date of its type in the Dominion.

Former owner and manager E. R. Gunner of Letchworth, Herfordshire, says the plant can handle 6,000 hogs and 250 head of cattle a week. Prior to FAME's take-over, the plant was killing 1,500 hogs and 50 cattle weekly.
