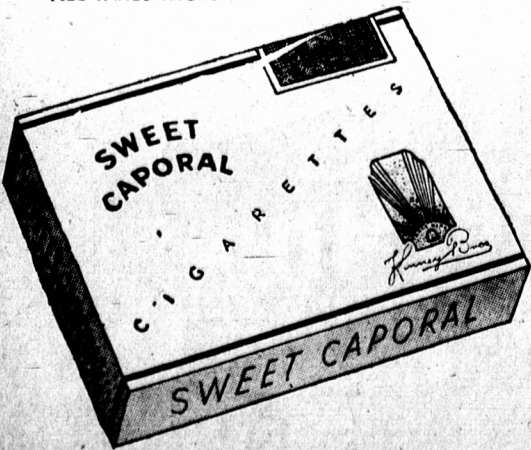

### Contract Bridge

#### SECONDARY BIDS

It is the style of some players (including a few experts) to pass originally if there is the slightest doubt about the hand's honor values, and then to re-enter the auction on a following round. Like almost all other bidding theories, this one has some merit—but it involves at least as much danger as is present in light opening bids! For example:

South dealer.  
Neither side vulnerable.

South's thought-process is not hard to reconstruct. His holding came extremely close to opening-bid requirements under any system, and so, inasmuch as he "controlled" himself and passed on the first round, he had complete license to overcall East's bid of one heart. If, however, this was South's line of thought, it did not work out well! West also had reason to "like his hand," and his prompt penalty double of one nctrump put South into a highly untenable position. There was "no place North-South could go." To improve their position—two diamonds, on the 4-4 fit, could have been punished just as severely as one nctrump.

West opened his own five-card club suit instead of leading partner's hearts, and although the club combination in dummy and declarer's hand provided a double stopper, this was small space to South! Defending perfectly, East-West held declarer to precisely these two club tricks, and thus collected a five-trick, 900-point penalty against a contract of merely one-odd, not vulnerable!

It is always unwise to take action on a hand such as South's opposite a passing partner. The hand contains considerable defense, but it is not the sort of hand one should want to play, if dummy turns up very weak! By the same token, if dummy is not so weak, the opponents will surely not "go anywhere."
