**FARM SHORT COURSE**  
 The Vocational School with the assistance and cooperation of the Department of Agriculture is planning for farm people over fifteen years of age a general course in agriculture. Present plans are for this course to continue on Monday, Tuesday and to offer instruction in animal husbandry, animal health, and farm management. Financial assistance will be available for young men and women taking part.  
 For young people either engaged in farming or contemplating it a course of this kind offers an excellent opportunity to gain information that will be of value for all time to come. There is a great deal to know about farming, no one knows all about it, most of us do not know enough but there is always the opportunity to learn and we would recommend the proposed course which the Vocational School of Agriculture and which additional information will be appearing through the press.

**STABILIZATION BILL**  
 Last week we commented upon the bill which had been introduced in the House of Commons and pointed out that considerable concern had been voiced already. The Minister of Agriculture has announced certain changes which he will recommend. First the formula is to be based on ten-year average rather than three.  
 This change if made will of course have the effect of increasing to some degree the base price which price supports will be calculated but it will likely mean that the guaranteed price would continue to decline until perhaps 1962 at which point it would start upward but slowly.

In addition the advisory committee is to be made up of farmers and representatives of farm organizations rather than to "include representation from" farm organization as was previously stated.
