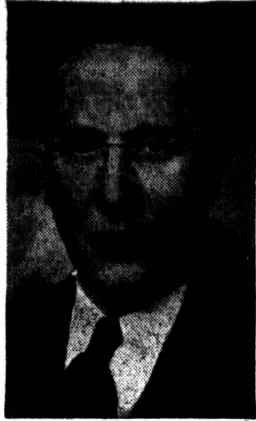

NEW YORK (AP)—Railroads and aircrafts carried the stock market higher Wednesday while many industrials lagged.

The Associated Press average of 90 stocks advanced to an all-time peak of \$160.50 with a 40-cent increase. Volume amounted to 3,030,000 shares.

Curtis-Wright Corp. raised its quarterly dividend and reported favorable earnings, sending the stock up 1 1/2 at 22 1/2, the second most active issue.

Pennsylvania Railroad was the most active stock, climbing 1 1/2 at 27 1/2. Gas Wood was the third most active issue up 7/8.

Baldwin Lima fourth, unchanged at 16 1/2 and Canadian Pacific fifth, up 3/4 at 31.

Among Canadian stocks, International Nickel advanced 1/2 and Distillers Seagram was ahead 1/4 while McIntyre lost 1/4 and Dome Mines declined 1/4.

On the American exchange, Giant Yellowknife was off 1/4.

## Montreal Stocks

MONTREAL (CP)—The stock market was thoroughly mixed at the close of active trading Wednesday.

Aluminium advanced 1 1/2 to 83 1/2, Canada Cement and Minnesota and Ontario each improved a point at 39 and 56 1/2, respectively, Shawinigan firmed 3/4 at 52 1/2 and CPR was up 3/4 at 30 1/2.

Noranda at 87 1/2 and Hudson Bay at 57 each lost a point. Consolidated Papers at 63 1/2 was 1/2 lower. Oil 1/2 were Abestoc at 45, Gypsum at 58 1/2 and Algoma at 52.

Miscellaneous industrials and senior metals were mixed. Senior oils were slightly higher. Steels were a shade easier. There was little change in the remainder of the industrial market.

Consolidated Denison was up 25 cents at \$4.15. Western oils fluctuated in a penny range.

The stock exchange's closing averages show banks up .01 at 49.47, utilities off .01 at 120.9, industrial up .01 at 253.8, combined up .01 at 200.4, papers off 4.68 at 1196.52 and goods up 0.55 at 70.81.

## Toronto Stocks

TORONTO (CP)—The stock market eased a shade in morning trade Wednesday, but picked up in the afternoon and ended about where it started.

Maintravagance issues were the one bright spot, showing their best gains of the year. Geo climbed 1 1/2 to \$13.75, Willroy 15 cents to \$2.35 and Consolidated Howey 20 to \$4.00.

Noranda fell \$1 to \$87.50 in base metals but other changes were fractions.

Western oils had fair gains including Calgary and Edmonton up 25 cents to \$16, Home Oil 45 to \$9.35, Merrill 20 to \$9.25 and Western Leaseholds 20 to \$5.30. Esasior were Okalta, Canada Oil Lands off 40 cents to \$3.55, and Anglo Canadian.
