Will Tour Britain And The Continent

Rev. Dr. E. Melville Aitken and Mrs. Aitken of Hamilton, Ontario, are sailing from Quebec for Southampton on July 7th, on the S.S. "Scythia." They are making a tour of Great Britain and the continent. They expect to spend the first two weeks in England with headquarters at the English-Speaking Union in London. They are then crossing to France to visit Paris, Switzerland and will then proceed to Italy, Rome and other points of interest.

Returning from Rome they will make a tour of Scotland. Spraying Advised For Beetle Problem

Flea beetles are now feeding on the potato foliage and, because the plants in many fields are small as a result of late planting, a great deal of damage can be done unless these insects are controlled, states the weekly potato bulletin of the Science Service Laboratory. Colorado potato beetles are also present. If a DDT spray or dust is applied now it will kill these insects and reduce their populations throughout the summer.

Present indications are that root maggot injury of turnips will be severe unless hot, dry weather prevails until about the last of July. Because the time of attack is correlated with soil type, no general recommendation for the control of this pest can be given. Interested growers are therefore advised to consult the entomologists from whom the control measures most suitable to their particular areas may be obtained.
