CONTRACT BRIDGE

South dealer. Neither side vulnerable.
NORTH: A Q 4 2, K 8, 10 9 8, K 7 6
WEST: K 10 8, A 10 6 4, 5 4, Q 10 9 2
EAST: 7 6 5, Q J, A K Q 8, A 7 5 5
The bidding: South 1♠, West 2♠, North 3♠, East 3NT.
Opening lead—four of hearts. Bridge is such an easy game in some deals. For example, consider this hand played by G.C. H. Fox, of England, in a rubber bridge game. You may not approve of Fox's jump to two notrump, considering his heart holding, but the rebid was typical of the English style—dashing and optimistic. West led a heart and Fox won with the jack. He could count seven sure tricks—a spade, a heart, three diamonds, and two clubs. The most promising suit to develop was clubs. All that was required for the contract to be made was for East to have been dealt Q-x or Q-x-x of clubs.

Summit Meeting Hopes Dimmed

WASHINGTON (AP) — State Secretary Herter was reported Eisenhower that the foreign ministers' deadlock at Geneva has this week to have told President Eisenhower that the foreign ministers' deadlock at Geneva has dimmed hopes of arranging a satisfactory summit meeting. Herter is understood also to have stressed that Premier Khrushchev appears to be trying to freighten the West into a summit parley rather than pave the way for reasonable negotiations on Germany's future. Herter and Eisenhower talked for an hour at the White House, one day after Herter's return from Geneva. The future of the Geneva talks to ease tensions over Russia's drive to force the Western allies out of Berlin was the big topic. WILL BE ON TV Herter also arranged to give the American people a television-radio report Tuesday night. It will be carried live by all the major radio networks and by the NBC and CBS TV networks at 9 p.m. EDT (7 p.m. MDT) running for 15 minutes. ABC TV will carry a delayed telecast. Aides said Herter would emphasize the West's determination to avoid further concessions to the Russians lest it jeopardize the freedom of the West Berliners. To mobilize Congressional support for his attitude, Herter also agreed to give a confidential summary of the Geneva talks to the Senate foreign relations committee and the House of Representatives foreign affairs committee Tuesday.

Diogenes To Be Sunk

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—The United States Coast Guard will sink the 18-foot tank Diogenes if it can be located. Diogenes caught fire Sunday about 200 miles off Cape Race, Nfld. Her three Montreal crewmembers were removed by the British freighter Ramon de Larrinaga bound for Rotterdam. The adventurers had hoped to sail and drift their weird craft to Europe. But now they'll make the trip in comparative comfort. The freighter sighted red flares and signal lights off the Newfoundland coast early Sunday and sped to investigate. She reached Diogenes two hours later and removed skipper Richard Melisch, Albert Barth and Robert Franz, all in good condition. The three naturalized Canadians started their journey from here June 13. They had hoped to reach Europe in three months. At the rate they were travelling it would have taken about twice that time. Anyway, Diogenes' short life has just about ended. Search and Rescue said the steel contraption is a hazard to navigation and it will be removed.

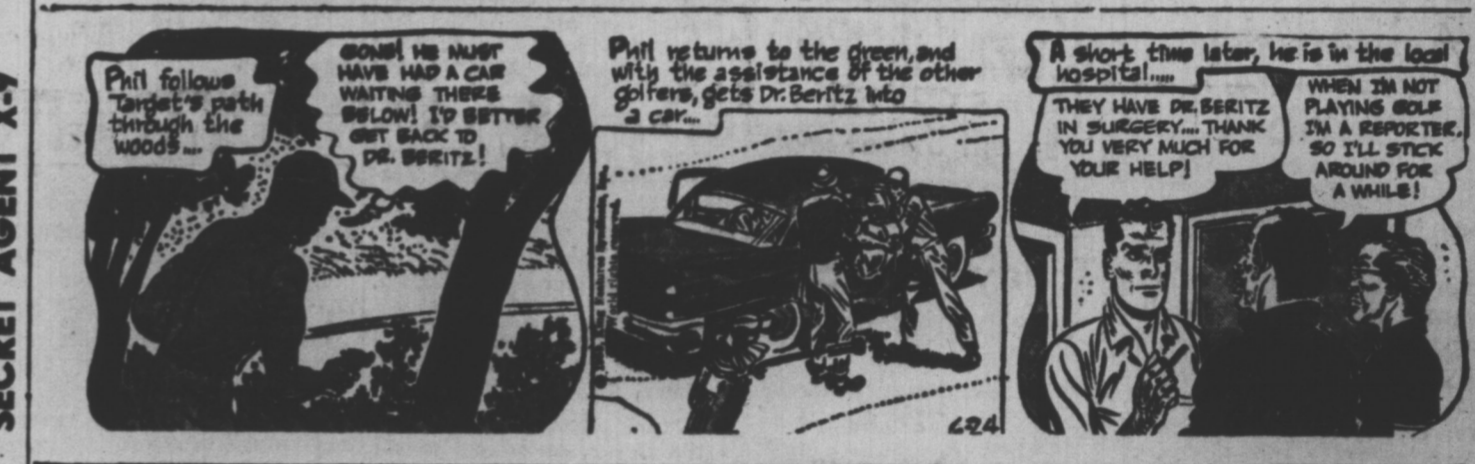
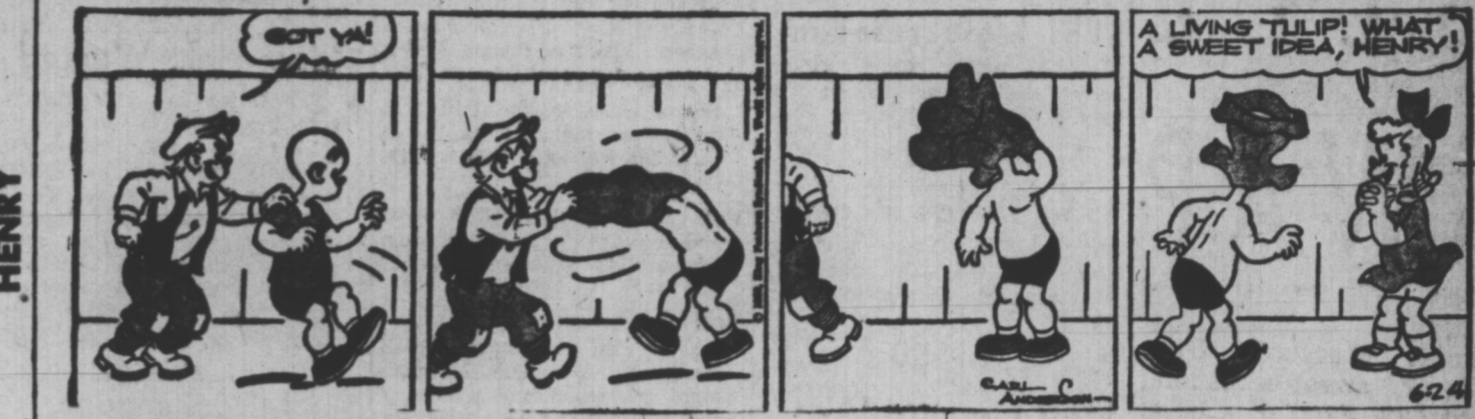
