lead, arsenic, fourth in magnesium. In 1910 saw the first electrically operated washing machine and the first practical electric cooking range. In 1925 the first hermetically sealed electric refrigerator went on the market. Also in 1925, the Bell Telephone Lab. developed mechanisms for electric recording of sounds. On March 10, 1876, the first sentence was transmitted over a phone hookup. Here's the sentence: "Mr. Watson, come here, I want you." It was A. G. Bell calling his assistant at 5 Exeter Place, Boston. One of the wonders of the world is the 1,200 mile long coral reef of Australia — a living museum. Here, too, may be seen turtles so large that a man can ride on their backs. The famous wool producing sheep of Australia — the Merinas — were imported from George III's flock at Kew, England.
