Austro-Russian Difficulty. VIENNA, Nov. 20. The speeches delivered by the Austrian delegation at Pesh on the 17th, have created a great sensation throughout Austria.

Egyptian Troops Deserting. CAIRO, Nov. 20. The Egyptian troops who have been ordered to the Sudan provinces to assist the Governor of Kordofan in his opposition to the False Prophet, El Medhi, are very much disaffected.

Stanley's Congo Station Attacked. LONDON, Nov. 20. Despatches received yesterday announce that Stanley's Station on the Upper Congo River, Africa, has been attacked by natives.

The Joyce Murderers. DUBLIN, Nov. 20. Myles Joyce's trial commenced on Friday last for the murder of Mrs. Joyce, wife of his (Myles) cousin. Judge Barry's charge on Saturday was strong against the prisoner, and the jury returned a verdict of guilty after ten minutes deliberation.

German Deficit. BERLIN, Nov. 20. The deficit in the German Budget, presented on Saturday, was announced to be thirty millions of marks.

Foot Ball. MONTREAL, Nov. 20. A Foot Ball match took place in New York, on Saturday, between the Britannia Club of Montreal and the British Club of New York. The contest was brisk and resulted in a victory for the Canadians.

GENERAL CABLE NEWS.

VIENNA, Nov. 17. At the sitting of the delegation yesterday, the report of the committee on the foreign office budget was presented. The committee expressed a conviction that an Austro-Russian war was sooner or later inevitable.

LONDON, Nov. 17. Before the rules of procedure are disposed of in the Commons, Mr. Gladstone will submit a new regulation for the election of chairmen of committees.

PARIS, Nov. 17. A fire occurred, to-day, in a school-house near Guimper. Nine children were burned to death.

NEW YORK, Nov. 17. Christian Jansen, a Danish poet, aged 60, was, yesterday, killed at Randolph's crossing in New Brunswick, N. J., by a Pennsylvania Railway train.

PARIS, Nov. 17. Extensive floods in various parts of the country are reported. There have been several wrecks on the west coast and some loss of life.
