## UPEI field hockey team heads for first playoff

The UPEI Lady Panthers completed their most successful regular season ever in Atlantic Universities field hockey Saturday when they battled the Mount Allison Lady Mounties to a scoreless tie.

The fourth place Lady Panthers now advance to the playoffs for the first time, where they will meet playoff tourney host and regular season champion University of New Brunswick Red Sticks in semi-final play Saturday, Oct. 22 in Fredericton, N.B. Saint Mary's and University of Moncton will meet in the other semifinal with the two winners advancing to the final on Sunday.

Defending league champion UNB beat Saint Mary's 5-1 on Saturday to finish in first place.

Saturday's game at UPEI's MacAdam Field was a tight struggle throughout. UPEI had the clear advantage in play in the first half, but was unable to score. Mount Allison had a few scoring opportunities but did not threaten for most of the half.

The second half was much more closely contested, but again UPEI had the better quality chances, just failing to side. Both goaltenders were sharp as they had to make quality saves. UPEI's Sandy Jardine came up big when a Mount Allison forward found herself in alone only to see Jardine make a great pad save.

After the game forward Shelagh Norman said the outcome was not what the team wanted.

"We're disappointed. There was something missing today. I don't

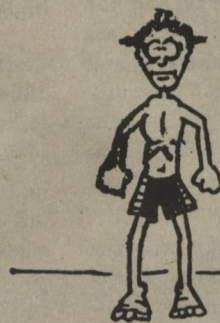
know what. We played well in the first half, I think we lost it in the second half. However we made the playoffs that's the main thing, anything from here on inis gravy."

Rookie Frances Moffet who led the team with three goals says the team is looking forward to the playoffs.

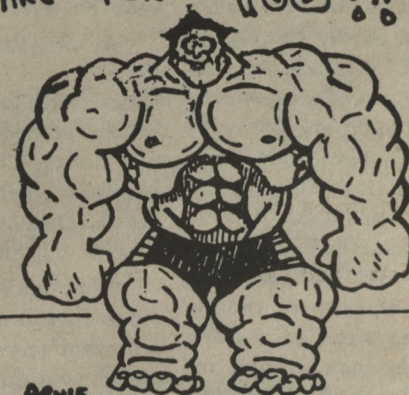
"We're obviously disappointed in this game, but we're happy to be in the playoffs. We'd like to show the other teams that this is no little team from the Island."
