Final Returns In India's Election

NEW DELHI (AP)—A final report on India's marathon general election Friday gave Prime Minister Nehru's ruling Congress Party 365 of the 488 seats in Parliament's lower house.

The Communists won 27 seats, Praja (People's) Socialists 19, Janh Sangh four and independents and minor parties 73.

In 13 state legislatures, Congress won 1,889 seats, with the opposition parties sharing 1,012.

Only the election in five snow-bound Himalayan states remain to be held. Voters will go the polls there in May.

Nehru Friday was re-elected leader of the Congress party in Parliament but said he does not feel happy about continuing in office all the time.

13 Deaths By Fire In Week

Fires broke out at widely-separated points across Canada this week, killing 13 persons, severely injuring seven and leaving several others homeless. In addition one woman is missing.

Three persons were killed and another three were severely injured at Vancouver Thursday when a blaze destroyed the six-story, 95-room Butler Hotel. Damage was estimated at \$100,000.

A fire in Montreal Wednesday killed six persons and wiped out a tenement in the crowded east end where a slum clearance program was about to begin. The victims were identified as a mother and father and their four children.

A fire Thursday at Cranbrook, B.C., killed four children when a house built of cardboard on the city dump went up in smoke. The children ranged in age from 18 months to six years.

In Yarmouth, N.S., three firemen were injured Wednesday while battling a blaze that caused an estimated \$100,000 damage. The fire destroyed three firms in the downtown shopping centre.

A fire at Victoria Wednesday destroyed British Columbia's first legislative building. Damage was estimated at \$100,000.

A fire near Cloverdale, B.C., Friday destroyed a farmhouse and adjoining garage. One man was severely injured and firemen searched the embers to determine whether his wife died in the blaze.

MAINE REPORTS Earth Tremors

PORTLAND, Me. (AP)—Maine's first earth tremors since late 1948 were reported Friday by residents of the Deering district of Portland.

Mrs. Margaret Russell of Cray Road said her "whole house shook terribly."

"I was standing in front of the wash bowl and it knocked me off my feet," she said.

Rev. Daniel J. Linehan reported two "pretty weak" shocks were recorded on the Boston college seismograph at Weston, Mass., at 8:50:23 a.m. and 9:33:39 a.m. He placed them at about 60 miles from Weston.

Portland, about 100 miles from Weston, reported the tremors at about the time of the second shock noted on the seismograph.

The last tremors recorded at the U.S. weather bureau here shook the Milo, Sebec and Atkinson area in Central Maine Nov. 29, 1948.
