Adenauer Openly Shows
Berlin Taks Opposition

BERLIN (AP)—Chancellor Adenauer of West Germany Tuesday night declared himself openly in conflict with the British-backed United States policy of going ahead with the exclusive Berlin talks with the Soviet Union.

"I see no ground for continuing the talks," he told a press conference on a visit to Communist-encircled West Berlin.
