UK Pledges To Guard Native Rights In New State Planned In Africa

LONDON, June 19 (Reuters) - The government Wednesday placed before parliament a scheme to merge three central African territories into one federal state of about 500,000 square miles, roughly the size of Quebec Province.

The government pledges itself to safeguard the rights of the 6,350,000 Africans living in the region by proposing the creation of an African Affairs Board with power to refer any white-versus-black dispute to London.

The Africans, who oppose the scheme, fear that federation will give the whip hand to the 200,000 Europeans - a mere handful - living in the three territories.
