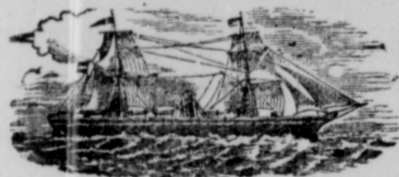

**CANNED GOODS AGAIN.**—Poisoning, said to be caused by American canned fruits, made over a score of guests in a London hotel ill. One man died.

**HEARD FROM AT LAST.**—The Larque Maiden City, Bradley, has arrived at Barbadoes from St. John. The fact of its arrival will be heard with particular interest by many as the vessel sailed some six months ago for a South American port at which she never arrived. The experiences of those on board will prove a thrilling tale.

**GOLD AT DAWSON.**—The Sun, of Dawson says: "A man with a large sized jag on and a well filled gold sack under his arm was making his way down First avenue, Saturday, and when in front of the Sun office his "poke" sprang a leak, and about \$1,000 of the contents were distributed over some twenty feet of the street. The surface was carefully cleaned up and carried off in bags and almost the entire amount recovered.

**WILL PROHIBITION TOUCH THIS.**—The Annals for Chemie, a Berlin scientific paper announces that dried up beer in the form of lozenges is the newest thing that chemical science has been able to produce. The lozenges are pressed out of a powder obtained by the evaporation of common lager beer and contain all the original ingredients. To convert the powder into beer it is only necessary to dissolve the lozenges in water, adding a little carbonic acid.

**BLASTING BY STEAM.**—Mr. H. Schaw is said to have invented a method of blasting by electricity and steam combined. Mr. Schaw found by experiment that it would be easy to boil water in a cartridge by using a thin coil of platinum wire through which electricity is sent. The steam pressure within the cartridge would rise to 150 pounds per square inch and far in excess of that. If the water cartridge is successful in mining, its application to heavy blasting may be made of use by railroad engineers, western mining concerns and in large quarries.

**AN ENGLISHMAN.**—The Dominion line include in their fleet of Canadian and Boston steamers an Irishman and a Scotsman, and to these to be added an Englishman. The latter is the new name to be given to the steamer Sandusky, which has been purchased by the Dominion Line for the Canadian service. She is to be refitted for the passenger trade at Belfast. The Sandusky is a twin-screw steamer of 6,315 tons gross, and 4,115 ton net. She was built in 1891 by the Messrs Harland & Wolff with two sets of engines, 19 in. 31 in. and 52 in. by 42 in stroke and was owned by the Union Steamship Company.

**CURED STUTTERING.**—A letter from Manila relates an instance of the curious effect of a Mauser bullet which sought to impede the circulation of one of the fighting Americans there. Private Redmond, Colorado Vol., stuttered so badly when he enlisted that the recruiting officer came near leaving him off the rolls. Private Redmond was wounded in the battle of Marquina, March 31. Now his wound is healed and he stutters no more. A Mauser bullet struck him in the face, passed diagonally downward through his mouth and made its exit near the back of the neck. It was considered a frightful wound by the surgeons, but Redmond proceeded to recover even faster than patients with less painful injuries. Now all that can be seen of the wound is a small livid spot to the left of the nose and above the upper lip. Redmond chews hard tack with the greatest zest and tells stories he has not been able to finish for years on account of his halting speech. He insists that the Mauser bullet carried away his vocal impediment.

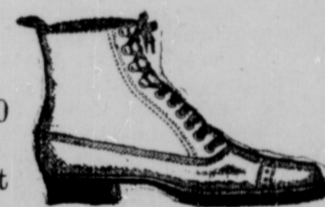
