A FEW weeks ago, we laid before our readers a copy of a Minute of Council, passed by the Dominion Cabinet, in which \$750,000 was offered as an indemnity to British Columbia...

The general features of the above Minute are such that this government found no objection in coming to the aid of the Dominion Government in this respect...
