IN MEMORIAM

MICHAEL MCCARTHY
On the morning of December 10th residents of Morell Rear learned with regret the passing of one of its oldest and most respected citizens, Michael McCarthy, in his 92nd year.
The late Mr. McCarthy was born in Morell and had lived all his life in this community, where he engaged in farming and building. The beautiful home, facing the parish church in Morell Rear, and innumerable homes and farm buildings in a wide area throughout the eastern section of the province stand today like living monuments to his ingenuity and craftsman's hand, and from his home there ever radiated such a friendly atmosphere that spelled "welcome" to all and earned for him from all his friends the affectionate name of "Pa".
The late Mr. McCarthy retired from active work several years ago, but up to about a year ago he was still able to maintain a keen interest in all the activities of the home and community, and was always ready to lend a helping hand at minor chores when occasion or emergency demanded.
Mr. McCarthy was an exemplary Christian and for the past decade of his life was a daily worshipper at Holy Mass in his parish church.
His wife, the former Matilda Hughes, predeceased him, also two sons, Patrick and Joseph. In his last illness he was tenderly cared for by his daughter-in-law, Mrs. Ephraim Malone and her family, with whom he made his home. The remaining members of his family are: Sister Philip of Neri, Western Hospital, Alberton; Mrs. Walter Miller (Margaret), New Haven, Conn.; Philip and Matilda, in New York; Plus, in Charlotteville, and Mrs. Frank Myers, (Valeria), in Head of Hillsboro. Twenty-two grandchildren and one great grandchild.
The funeral took place on the morning of December 13th from his late residence to the Parish Church of St. Lawrence O'Toole, Morell Rear, where Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated by the pastor, Rev. Eric Robin with Rev. Phelan McKenna, Deacon, Rev. Reginald Phelan Sub-deacon and Rev. Floyd McGaughey, Master of Ceremonies.

REV. WILLIAM HAMILTON
The death took place recently at Banton Harbor, Mich., U.S.A. of Rev. William J. Hamilton, only son of the late Mr. William J. Hamilton and Mrs. Hamilton, (nee Jennie MacPhee). Rev. Mr. Hamilton was a grandson of the late Mr. and Mrs. Angus MacPhee, Hopefield, P.E.I.

PETER CALLAGHAN
Death, the inexorable grim reaper in the law of nature, claimed the life of Peter Callaghan, one of the oldest of Ebbesfleets' native born citizens on Dec. 14th, 1957, at the advanced age of 89 years.
He was the last member of a family of four brothers and three sisters. His father, the late William Callaghan, emigrated with a youth with his father from Halifax, to Charlottetown and thence to the beautiful cove of Ebbesfleet (then Mimmingsh).

Mr. Callaghan had been indisposed for some years, due to a broken hip sustained in a fall. The large number of friends and relatives attending his wake and funeral, comprising people from Charlottetown and intermediate points and neighbors from West Cape to Tignish and north Cape testified to the popularity and respect in which he was held. The numerous Mass Cards and messages of sympathy to the family are further testimony to this.
He leaves to mourn the memory of a kind and prudent father, three sons and three daughters, Viz, Harris and Winston, Ebbesfleet; Merritt, Alberton; Hazel, Mrs. James Lawless, Newboro; Della, Mrs. Louis O'Connor, Clinton; and Patricia, Mrs. Frank McDougall, Kinkora; also a large number of nieces and nephews.
His revered wife, the former Matilda Hogan of North Cape, predeceased him six years ago.
His funeral took place at the Immaculate Conception Church, Palmer Road of which he was a trustee for many years, on the morning of Dec. 16th, 1957.
