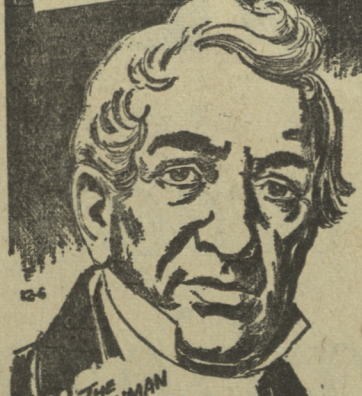

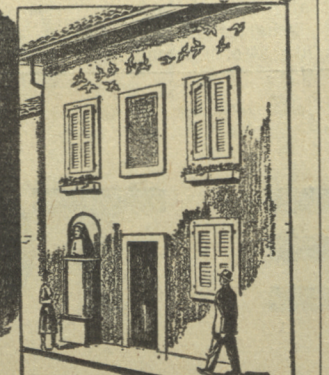

CONTRACT BRIDGE

usually obtains the lead with the ace of diamonds and returns a heart. The A-10 of hearts, sitting over dummy's J-9, then score two tricks to defeat the contract, declarer losing two hearts, a diamond and a club.

East's defense is guided by one of the most important principles of defensive play. In choosing his defense, East dismisses from his mind any holding declarer might have which would make the contract impregnable.

Thus, East assumes declarer does not have the ace of diamonds. East of course realizes that South may have that card, but for practical purposes this possibility is dismissed since, if South has the ace, the contract is unbeatable. East cannot afford to adopt a defeatist attitude.

Once the diamond ace is granted to West, East can count three defensive tricks. Obviously, a fourth trick is necessary if the contract is to be defeated. There is no hope that West has a trump trick, considering that South bid spades twice.

The only possible source for a fourth trick lies in hearts. If West has the queen there is a chance to beat the contract. So East, who does not see either the South or West hands, but only the dummy, proceeds on the basis that West has both the ace of diamonds and queen of hearts.

As things turn out in this deal, virtue is rewarded. The low heart return defeats the contract.

De Gaulle Has Clear Field In French Presidency Race

PARIS (CP)—Gen. Charles de Gaulle was given a clear field Monday night to run for the presidency of the new French republic and, in effect, let it be known he is ready to take the job. His election, by a newly-created and large electoral college, is a virtual certainty. De Gaulle's office disclosed the development with a communique confirming that President Rene Coty and Premier de Gaulle have been consulting about the election and that Coty doesn't want to stand again.

The fact that de Gaulle's office allowed the communique to be issued was virtual confirmation of what everyone in France has believed—that the new constitution is tailor-made for de Gaulle as the first president of the Fifth Republic. The job carries much more power than formerly.

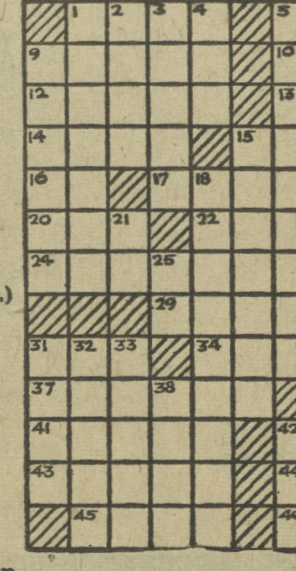
