

Urges Improved Tourist Service For Maritimes

Mr. Cyrus S. Eaton, famous American industrialist and a native of Pugwash, Nova Scotia, believes that the Maritime Provinces with their cool summer climate have much to offer the heat oppressed citizens of the United States, but that the transportation service, especially by air, should be improved.

He pictures the Maritimes being to summer tourists what Florida is to the winter tourist who leaves the northern states and Canada to escape the winter cold. This is not the first time Mr. Eaton has called attention to this fact.

At the opening of the Charlotte-town Exhibition in 1954 he said, "If many people of the United States who are now sweltering in the heat know of the cool sea breezes which you have here, they would come in such numbers that all the ferries you could put into operation would not be able to look after the traffic."

LETTER TO PREMIER
In a recent letter written to Premier A. W. Matheson, Mr. Eaton enclosed a clipping from a Cleveland paper depicting a 94 degree heat wave.

The letter reads as follows: "Dear Mr. Prime Minister: "This front page report from Cleveland's leading newspaper of the heat wave that is gripping the eastern United States points the way to tremendous economic opportunities for the four Maritime Provinces. At a time like this, hundreds of thousands of American tourists could be attracted by the superb weather and beauty of the countless seaside spots of the Maritimes if the four Provinces would join in an aggressive campaign to advertise their summer-time charms, after first arranging for swift and frequent air transportation from New York, Philadelphia, Baltimore, Washington, Boston, and Cleveland.

"With schools out for the summer, entire families are in the mood to get away from the hot cities to cool vacation places. The Maritimes have a considerable advantage over the winter resorts like Florida that have to compete with the school season.

"The greatest handicap to the Maritimes has been lack of adequate transportation, especially by air. The policy of the late government in insisting on a TCA monopoly dealt the Maritimes a serious blow. With the change in government, now is the time for the Provinces to insist that the substantial plane service be expanded to get the much broader flying facilities that are required, it would doubtless be necessary to enlist the interest of one or more of the large, well-financed, well-equipped, private-owned air lines of the United States.

"The potential for improving the economic welfare of the Maritimes through greater tourist business is so tremendous that it becomes the sacred duty of everyone in public or private life who is truly devoted to these four great provinces to exert every effort not only to let the world know of all that the Maritimes have to offer, but also to make it easy for would-be visitors to reach the Maritimes."

Five Trapped Miners Rescued
STUBENVILLE, Ohio (AP) — All five miners, trapped 14 hours by a cave-in, were rescued Wednesday night. All survived the ordeal in good condition.

The miners were trapped in the small mine, Betsy No. 3 of Powhatan Mining Company, near Fernwood, about seven miles southwest of here Wednesday morning when the overburden of rock and dirt caved in.

A huge auger drilled into the hillside under which the men were trapped. At a depth of about 200 feet it struck into the chamber into which they had been walled by the slide. As the 36-inch diameter bit was withdrawn, the men crawled through the hole behind the drill. No one had to go in to assist them.

The hole which provided the avenue to safety was the third drilled since the mining auger arrived at the scene. Rock slides had blocked the other two drilling efforts.

New P. W. C. Scholarships

Ten new scholarships and eight bursaries for students entering third and fourth years at Prince of Wales were announced at the College yesterday.

The ten scholarships will have an annual value of \$300 each and will be awarded on the basis of all around general ability, academic achievement, extra curricular activities and need.

The eight bursaries will be worth \$125 each and will be granted on the basis of need and promise.

In assigning the necessary funds the Board of Trustees of the College has considered that every possible must be done to encourage promising students. With the new awards it is felt that no young person of ability need be deprived of a College education for lack of funds.

Applications for the scholarships and bursaries may be secured at the College. Completed forms should be sent to the Principal before August 15th. The awards will be announced shortly after that date. Any student entering Third or Fourth Year may apply.

Before County Magistrate

At Queen's County Magistrate's Court on Wednesday morning, an accused, charged with driving while intoxicated, entered a plea of guilty to a charge of driving while impaired, and was fined \$65.00 and costs or 30 days.

For possession of intoxicating liquor in a place other than his residence, the convicted party was fined \$20.00 and costs or 30 days, and two females, charged with unlawful possession of an intoxicating beverage, were both remanded to July 3rd. A similar remand was given in the case of an accused charged with possession of a still for the purpose of illegally manufacturing spirits.

Fines of \$5.00 and costs each were imposed upon a garage operator for permitting the operation of a motor vehicle with defective brakes, and upon a person convicted for driving without an operator's license. A speeder was fined \$10.00 and costs and a youth was reprimanded for driving with a beginners license when not accompanied by a qualified driver.

A vagrant was sentenced to 30 days and the hearing of a person charged with fraud was further adjourned to July 3rd at the request of the Crown.
