THE APPEAL TO THE FARMERS.

The Liberal politicians just now are very anxious to catch the farmer, and so they are loud-mouthed friends of his.

The Liberal manufacturer, however, has discovered that Conservative Government mean what they say, and so he is very much troubled in spirit because the Government have brought down such a tariff as will kill monopolies like the biscuit combine, which Mr. Paterson, Grit M. P. for St. John's, joined. Let it be well understood that, as one of the speakers in the recent debate put it, the Government is favorable to a manufacturing tariff in the sense that they wish to encourage industry, employ labor, and keep in Canada the people the farmer must feed.

Mr. MARTIN, M. P. for Winnipeg, pointed in the House of Commons, a short time ago, to the financial record of the Province of Manitoba under Grit rule as a model one. He must surely have concluded that the members of the House were ignorant of the facts.

Now take the question of expenditure. The expenditure in 1888 was \$956,371.68. In 1892, that expenditure had grown \$1,192,169.28, or an increase in four years of \$235,798, or over 25 per cent.

Again, take the last four years of the Dominion Government and compare the Liberal Conservative record with the Grit record that Mr. Martin said he was proud of. In the past four years the expenditure has been kept stationary, and the debt has only increased about three million dollars, or less than 1 1/2 per cent. in the whole four years.

We hope that all feeling will not be engendered by reading of the letter of our correspondent, "A Parent." If Mr. Joy supposes that the reference to him was made by Mr. McDonald or anyone in the trade he is entirely mistaken.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR.

A PLEA FOR BETTER HIGH SCHOOLS

Sir,—It is surprising that, although much has been written respecting our educational system, no one has referred to our great need of better High Schools. The object of this letter is to show that the best results in our High Schools are frustrated by the prevailing opinions regarding the Prince of Wales College.

It is currently reported that it is the intention of the Government to erect a new College building. While it must be admitted that the present building is sufficient for the students at present in attendance at the Prince of Wales College, we must not lose sight of the fact that the greater number of these students could do as well or better in High Schools from which they have come.

Of the 180 students now at the College, more than half are studying in the first year course, which means that 90 students have come to Charlottetown to do High School work.

At the New Glasgow School, my pupils read mastered works of Racine, Corneille, Shakespeare, Ovid and Xenophon; while the standard of work done in mathematics and science, was equally high.

Under the present system our High Schools are discouraged from undertaking advanced work, because such work is not recognized by the Board of Education.

Every man who sends his son or daughter to Charlottetown to take up the First Year Course is thereby subjected to an unnecessary and most unjust expense for he should be allowed to get the same instruction from the High School at his door.

Suppose there are 100 students in the first year at the Prince of Wales College, and that their expenses for the term amount to \$100 each; this means a yearly tax of \$10,000 on the people of this Province, which is a heavy burden.

The students of the first year do not receive a good High School education at the College. The fact is that very few of them profit by the course.

It is not surprising that the chief cause of this is the fact that the students at the Prince of Wales College before they are sufficiently well prepared. In many cases, students are even admitted to the College who have never passed the entrance examination, although this is expressly forbidden by the school law.

The changes needed in our educational system are (1) That the first year should be at the Prince of Wales College; (2) The establishment of a Normal School, which will include students to attend College before they are fit to undertake the work.

NEWS NOTES.

The French Consul-General at Chicago will conform to the new rule laid down by his Government. He has applied for permission to marry a Chicago girl and it has been granted.

The Chicago Tribune, which keeps a record, declared that there were seventy-nine cases of lynching in the United States in the first four months of 1894.
