

Canada Council Makes Grant To Symphonies

SALMON
The Canada Council announced Tuesday that \$64,000 has been awarded to symphonies in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick and suggested there should be one orchestra for all four Atlantic provinces.

The grants were among nearly \$90,000 awarded to arts and studies in the Atlantic provinces.

The council announced a grant of \$15,000 to the New Brunswick Symphony Orchestra and \$29,000 to the Halifax Symphony Orchestra.

Council member Peter M. Dwyer told a press conference the council would be interested in one orchestra to serve the Atlantic provinces.

In Halifax, Mrs. S. S. Jacobson, president of the Halifax Symphony which has toured New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island, said the Halifax group would be interested in the suggestion.

NEPTUNE GET \$15,585
In other grants announced Tuesday, the Neptune Theatre of Halifax was awarded \$15,585. This was in addition to a \$75,000 basic grant given for the 1966-67 season the council said \$5,585 of the grant made Tuesday was for an eight-day tour of Newfoundland in October.

The New Brunswick Museum was given a grant of \$8,500 for its art museum and the Confederation Art Gallery in Charlottetown was awarded \$9,300.

Prof. H. C. Jain, former assistant professor of business administration at the University of New Brunswick, was awarded a \$1,600 grant for completion of a research project on industrial relations and settlement of disputes in the pulp and paper industry in the Atlantic provinces.

Halifax Man Is Charged With Murder

MONTREAL (CP) — Two charges of capital murder were placed Wednesday against Roland Leblanc of Halifax, accused of strangling two young women last week.

Leblanc, a 28-year-old accountant, was found criminally responsible for the deaths at a coroner's inquest Tuesday.

His preliminary hearing was set for Aug. 30. He asked the court for the services of a lawyer and was told one would be found.

He is charged in the deaths of Ginette Martineau and Charlotte (Shirley) Doucet, both 20. Miss Martineau was killed in a downtown Montreal rooming house Aug. 16 and Miss Doucet at a motel in suburban St. Laurent two days later. Leblanc was arrested in Hawkesbury, Ont., during the weekend.
