

MEMORANDUM

Students who plan to return to UPEI in September, 1983 are requested to complete an application form at the Registrar's Office before they leave for the summer.

Students who complete the application form may pick up pre-registration material during the summer so that they may register by mail and avoid the line-ups during September registration.

Students who choose their courses and pay their fees by mail will be required only to sign in when they return in September.

Students who choose their courses but do not pay their fees will be required to pay their fees and sign in when they return in September.

Some courses will have limited enrollments so students would be well advised to register by mail to avoid being turned down for a course that is filled.

Tues. 6. REGISTRATION. Seniors and Juniors in the morning; Sophomores and Freshmen in the afternoon; Partime students from 7 - 9 p.m.

Wed. 7. Classes begin for all courses other than those at the introductory level.

Thurs. 8. Classes begin for introductory level courses.

Mon. 12. FINAL DAY FOR LATE REGISTRATION.

Wed. 14. FINAL DAY FOR CHANGING COURSES OR SECTIONS.
