At the New York Auction sale Stewart autumn had showed surprising strength and there was close to a complete turn over of EMBA merchandise. Seasonal high for autumn hare standards was set at \$78 with Barney Wolman outbidding Max Stone for the top bundle. The shippers were Emmett and John Moyle, Anaortes, Washington. Top females sold for \$31.50. Complete report on the 1955 standard presentation showed a total of 49,338 skins, 5 per cent sold with females advancing 10 per cent and males 5 per cent. Stewarts, which comprised 17 per cent of the catalogue were almost completely sold with advances in line with standard goods. There was general agreement in the room that this was the strongest autumn hare sale of the season. Some in the room were frankly baffled by the unusual firmness of the offering. The fact that this was one of the last major sales of the year was seen by many as contributing to the firm tone. With six months to go before they could replenish their stock, dealers in short supply were bidding for merchandise.
