## Liquor Store Is Considered For Tignish

**TIGNISH** — Consideration is being given by the P.E.I. Temperance Commission to the establishing of a store for the sale of liquor here, it was learned last night.

The request was made to the commission some time ago by the village commissioners and the commission has been given the matter careful study.

However, drawbacks to the proposal are the lack of banking facilities in Tignish and the fact that a vendor is already located at Alberton, 10 miles away.

The commission has not yet reached any definite decision on the matter.

## Parade Plans Finalized For Lobster Carnival

Forty-five floats have already been assured for the Summerside Lobster Carnival parade, and about ten more are likely to be added to the list, as reported by Dave Carnegie, chairman of the float parade committee. A meeting of the central committee of the Lobster Carnival was held last evening.

Mr. Carnegie also announced that six bands will be included in the parade which is expected to exceed some 70 separate units.

Mr. Carnegie said the parade will form on the marine wharf and proceed along a route 2.45 miles in length. Leaving the wharf the parade will move west on Water Street to Central Street where it will turn north and proceed to Fitzroy, then eastward to Granville Street where it will head north to Schurman Avenue, then west to Central Street where it will turn south and proceed to Notre Dame Street and hence to the carnival headquarters at the Stadium where the serving of the delicious lobster suppers will commence.

The carnival committee last evening decided to judge the floats in two classifications—business and organizations—and to award cash prizes of \$40, \$25, and \$10 to the three best floats in each of these groups.

In addition to this, the Bill Lynch Plaque will be awarded to the best float in the parade.

It was suggested that judging of the floats would be done on the wharf after the parade has been assembled, and qualified judges from outside of this area will do the judging.

## Summerside Board Of Trade Has Shipment Set For North

A committee of the Summerside Board of Trade, composed of producers, manufacturers and shippers, under chairmanship of Lester Jenkins, have overcome some of the initial obstacles encountered in their efforts to sell local products to the northern markets, and will be making an initial shipment to these markets on a ship that will be calling at Charlottetown on June 22.

In a serious effort to develop this potential market this first shipment of Island merchandise will be made although the products have not yet been sold.

The committee hopes to be able to send or obtain a representative to look after their interests in this area when the ship delivers the merchandise. It is also the hope of the committee that this representative will be able to extend the sale of Island food items for future shipments to this attractive new market area.

Included in the consignment from Summerside will be potatoes and canned foods.

With president A.H. Hubley presiding at the meeting last night, Summerside Board of Trade members endorsed in principle a resolution from the Alberton-West Prince Board of Trade, urging the construction of a paved road starting at Ellerslie corner along the existing road via the Barlow Road through Freehold, Foxley River and McNally's Point, with the construction of a causeway bridge across Cascumpe Bay at the old Gordon wharf site, connecting with the newly announced paving program through Cascumpe.
